Welcome to the Terrors

A warm welcome back to the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium for this afternoon's Pitching In Isthmian League fixture and we extend that welcome to everyone connected with our visitors from Tooting & Mitcham United FC.

Compared to the last couple of curtailed seasons, our opponents have had a disappointing time in the current campaign and, at the time of writing, before the midweek fixtures, they are sitting in fourteenth place, though just three points behind the Woods in eleventh.

The Terrors got off to a poor start, going out in the FA Cup extra preliminary round before most of us had even started the season, and then lost their opening games at Westfield and at home against Thatcham Town.

Things did pick up in September and into October with a run of home wins, including our own comprehensive 7-3 defeat suffered at Imperial Fields.

The Woods actually led early that afternoon through Connor Cullen and, after conceding twice to be behind on just 15 minutes, we levelled three minutes later with a goal from William Dupray.

It was 3-2 to the home side by half-time but with the wind behind them in the second half they romped to their biggest victory of the season to date with Sesay completing a hat-trick, Dan Williams netting twice and with one each from Jamarie Brissett and Mark Waters.

Shakeel Morris bagged a late consolation for the Woods and, a few weeks later, made the switch to play for Tooting!

He played in a 2-1 win for the Terrors at Guernsey at the end of October but since then they have won just once more on their travels 1-0 at Thatcham Town in mid-December.

Goals have been hard to come by apart from a game I witnessed in early January at Bedfont Sports when they led 3-0 and 4-2 before somehow getting beaten 5-4 by the home side.

Since then, they lost top scorer Dan Williams to Bedfont Sports so their side remains an unsettled one.

Our two sides never met in last season's quickly curtailed campaign but in the 2019/20 season we had played both matches before the end came in early March.

At Tooting in August, we led at half-time with an Alex Witham strike but Danny Bassett levelled on the hour and deep into stoppage-time, it was Razzaq Coleman-De-Graft that burst free to net the winner. In the return match, played in January, it was another late goal, scored by Hady Ghandour, that secured all three points once again with a 1-0 success after the Woods had been reduced to ten men.

Our last victory over Tooting & Mitcham came in August 2018 when

a James Ewington hat-trick saw us come from the dead to win 4-3 here at Northwood while the away game ended in a 1-1 draw with current Woods defender Sam Jenkins scoring our goal.

League and Cup News

Three games in eight days and three wins! What more could we have hoped for with two of those games against top three sides and the other one against a side just ahead of us in the table at the time.

Marlow came to the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium two weeks ago having won seven games in a row but left with nothing as a Josh Helmore goal early in the second-half secured a 1-0 win and all three points.

We then travelled to Westfield a few days later for a tricky fixture under lights but notched our biggest league win of the season to date against former Northwood manager Simon Lane.

The 4-1 victory started once again with a Josh Helmore goal but was added to with Keagan Cole's first goal for the club and then two from Micah Jackson including a late penalty.

Last Saturday we made the short trip for the big Middlesex "derby" game at Uxbridge, looking to avenge the heavy 7-1 defeat we suffered earlier in the season.

With a good following of Northwood supporters at Honeycroft, the side responded superbly and second-half goals from Teddy Stacey and Josh Helmore pulled off another excellent 2-0 success.

It was our sixth successive away win in Isthmian League games (we have won all seven away games played since the new management team took over) which not only surpasses any run since we were first promoted to the Isthmian League back in 1992, it is also better than a run of five that we achieved in our London Spartan League title season of 1991/92.

We now have to go back to the club's Middlesex League days and the season of 1975/76 for a better run of results on our travels when the Woods actually won their first nine away games!

Josh Helmore's goal at Uxbridge means he has scored in all of his five games for the club since joining from Binfield which is a superb impact to make.

The last player to net a goal in six successive matches was Spencer Bellotti at the back end of the 2011/12 season so that's a possible target for Josh this afternoon.

Dean Clark achieved the same sequence back in 2004/05 when the Woods were playing Step 3 football in the Isthmian Premier.

Today's game is the first of four successive home games now though. where our form has been less impressive - though we have now won









our last two games played at the Fenton.

On Tuesday night we face Chalfont St Peter for the first time this season and then, next Saturday it's an early kick-off for the visit of Guernsey - 12.45pm.

Please also note that the first-team squad are organising a RACE NIGHT fundraiser for the early evening after this match so please make a note to stay on after the game and join in with what should be a fun evening,

After this, it's our Middlesex Senior Cup Semi-Final fixture at home to National League side Barnet so plenty of excitement hopefully to come over the next couple of weeks!

As well as the Barnet semi-final, we also face a quarter-final in the Middlesex Charity Cup next month with an away tie at Combined Counties League side CB Hounslow who we will be meeting for the first-ever time.

That's scheduled for a week after the Senior Cup game, on Tuesday 22nd February 2022.

Player News

Dan Purdue was unavailable for three games which allowed Dan Hosier to reclaim his place between the sticks after missing the Basingstoke match through injury.

Sam Jenkins missed the Westfield game with a groin strain but was back last Saturday which saw Micah Jackson ruled out with his injury problems.

Kyal Williams who impressed in our Basingstoke win, had a week on trial overseas in Kosovo but has decided that the offer wasn't beneficial to him and all being well he should be back available for selection today.

We also gave a first-team debut at Westfield to Under-18s striker Will Robinson who came on as a late substitute and looked lively.

Will is the son of former Woods utility player Colin Robinson who was at the game to see him make his debut some 24 years or so since he last played for Northwood!

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH CENTRAL DIVISION

The Northwood juggernaut shows no sign of slowing as they claimed the sixth successive league win on their travels and another top four scalp by overcoming third-placed Uxbridge in the local derby at a breezy Honeycroft.

Woods went into the game without the injured Micah Jackson with Alex More his replacement for his first league start, while there was a return for Sam Jenkins as Rvan Young reverted to the bench.

Northwood enjoyed the better of the early exchanges as they forced a couple of corners while Josh Helmore had

a close-range effort blocked after a run and pull-back from Sydney Ibie. But Uxbridge negotiated the early pressure and proceeded to try their luck with couple of long-range attempts from Anthony Mendy and Ezra Ndukuba which failed to trouble Woods keeper Dan Hosier.

Uxbridge began to probe the Woods rearguard with Ndukuba's shot being blocked before the loose ball was scrambled clear while the redoubtable Tommy Boxer cleared a Mendy shot off the line. And there was no let up for Northwood as former Wood Alex Witham latched onto Mark Goodman's crossto direct a cushioned header into the arms of Hosier

Woods were maintaining a good shape as they continued to rebuff the Uxbridge attacks and they reminded the visitors of their attacking prowess as they forced a corner from which Ibie saw his low cross-shot deflect off BaboucarrJarraand shave the upright. But the half ended









with Hosier being called upon to tip over a header from Sam Shaw

Northwood were forced into a change at the break as Young replacedCarl Stewart who picked up a knock in the opening half, Young dropping into the right wing-back berth with Jenkins pushing into midfield.

After Witham had an opportunity for the hosts soon after the restart, as he sent a shot wide of the target, Woods twice went close through Ibie -Jarra clearing his shot off the line after More had set up the chance with a strong run and cross while keeper Tyler Tobin saved another effort with his legs after the lively Northwood front man had collected a neat through ball from Helmore.

Uxbridge were soon asking questions again of the Northwood backline, James Gurteen throwing himself at a Mendy shot with Alex Paine's follow up being deflected wide before Witham saw his shot parried by Hosier as Andy Lomas blocked Ndukuba's follow up attempt.

But it was Northwood who finally broke the deadlock on 58 minutes as Helmore teed up Stacey who sent an unerring shot beyond Tobin from 20-yards.

Woods extended their advantage on 66 minutes after





being awarded a freekick, More's effort cannoning off the Uxbridge wall with Helmore latching on to the rebound and shooting across Tobin for his fifth goal in Northwood colours. Soon after another free kick, this time from Keagan Cole, found its way to Helmore who shot wide this time.

Uxbridge looked for a way back into the contest with Ndukubu dragging his shot wide, but the hosts continued to be thwarted with Boxer and Gurteen impressive once again for Woods in defence with skipper Cole enjoying another fine game as sweeper. When the Reds did break through the Northwood rearguard, Hosier was up to the test as he saved well from substitute Juwon Akintunde

Yiannis Constantinou and Matt Surmon were introduced for Helmore and More as Northwood looked to shore up things for the closing minutes. And after Mendy had received his marching orders on 90 minutes for what appeared to be an ill-advised comment to the assistant referee, the Woods nearly put the icing on another impressive win, Ibie being denied by Tobin after breaking clear deep into stoppage time.

Northwood kept their Middlesex League championship hopes alive with a dramatic winner three minutes from time on Saturday.

They started the match in fine style and moved the ball around confidently on the fine C.A.V. surface.

The visitors almost took the lead after only a few minutes when Martin Ellis raced clear of the stranded home defence but he guided the ball wide of the keeper but also saw it sail tantalisingly around a post. However, the hosts had slightly the better of the first half, though in the second Northwood threw away the lethargy and stormed back.

They were inspired by the fine display of Norman Heslop from right back during the next 45 minutes the Woods strung together some tremendous football.

The match moved into the final quarter and still the scoreline remained blank, and despite the intricate patterns weaved by Harvey, Tidd and Gould the Woods couldn't break the deadlock.

Harvey went close with a fine effort and then Cooper was close after a neat piece of football and crisp shot. Northwood's patience was finally rewarded in the 87th minute. 

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS...

TOOTING & MI

Tooting & Mitcham United FC was formed in 1932 when two local sides, Tooting Town and Mitcham Wanderers amalgamated, the club remaining in the London League until joining the Athenian League in 1937.

In 1938 the Surrey Senior Cup was won for the first time by beating Dulwich

Wartime then brought a mixture of friendly matches and a league called the South Fast Combination

The London Senior Cup was lifted in 1943 when Dulwich Hamlet were defeated 5-4.

When the Second World War ended the club returned to the Athenian League and were Champions in 1950 and 1955.

They also reached the FA Cup First Round Proper for the first time in 1948 unluckily losing by a goal to nil at Millwall and in 1950 reached the First Round Proper again with their first ever home tie against Football League opposition Brighton & Hove Albion, losing 3-2.

The club was invited to join the Isthmian League in 1956, the premier amateur league in the South, and they switched from playing in white shirts to black and white stripes.

That season saw the club reach the FA Cup Second Round Proper Josing to Queens Park Rangers.

In the 1957-58 season they were crowned Isthmian League Champions but were hit by tragedy when star goalkeeper Dave Moore was killed in a car crash soon after the title was won.

In season 1958-59 the club reached the 3rd round proper of the FA Cup for the first time in its history beating Football League clubs Bournemouth and Northampton Town.

In the third round they were drawn at home to Nottingham Forest, one of the top clubs in the country, and led the First Division side 2-0 at half-time but an own goal and a very controversial penalty for handball enabled Forest to scramble a draw.

In the replay the Midlands side won 3-0 played before a crowd of 42,362 and they went on to lift the FA Cup at Wembley.

The 1959-60 campaign was one of the best in the club's history the Isthmian League Championship was won for the second time and Tooting reached four Cup Finals, winning two.

The London Senior Cup was lifted as Bromley were beaten 5-0 and the Surrey Senior Cup was also won when Tooting defeated Walton & Hersham 3-0, great striker and Northern Ireland International Paddy Hasty getting a hat-trick.

Paddy would also play for the Great Britain Olympic team in the 1960 summer Olympics and was the last player to score a goal for Team GB until 2012.

Tooting were the first amateur side to reach the London Challenge Cup Final for over 30 years losing 2-1 to Chelsea at Stamford Bridge.

In March 1962 the club switched on their brand new floodlights and how

bright they were, the game against Arsenal was a classic as the Gunners were beaten 4-2 in a never to be forgotten evening.

The following season the team had a record 11-0 win over Welton Rovers in the Amateur Cup, the Tooting & Mitcham side containing several England Amateur Internationals.

Young goalkeeper Alex Stepney was a local lad who had come through the Tooting ranks and at the end of the 1962-63 campaign he joined Millwall and later played for Chelsea, Manchester United and the full England side against Sweden, a proud moment for Tooting & Mitcham.

Dario Gradi, who had an illustrious career as manager of Crewe Alexandra over a long period of time, also played for the Terrors in the early 1960's.

The 1974-75 season saw the club reach the FA Cup first round proper and a dream home tie with Crystal Palace.

The Terrors took a first minute lead through Steve Grubb but the Eagles hit back to win 2-1 in front of a 10,000 plus crowd at Sandy Lane.

The following season the club under the guidance of Roy Dwight had their best ever run in the FA Cup reaching the 4th round proper.

After beating Romford and Leatherhead away the Terrors had to travel again to Swindon Town in the Third Round and soon found ourselves 2-0 down but a dramatic fight back saw Tooting snatch a draw.

In the replay at a packed Sandy Lane Tooting had a great 2-1 victory with Alan lves scoring the winner after a fine solo run. In the 4th round the Terrors were drawn away yet again with a long trip to Bradford City and despite a brave performance lost 3-1.

The club also had their best ever run in the FA Trophy reaching the guarterfinal stage losing at eventual winners Scarborough by 1-0.

The club won the Surrey Senior Cup three seasons on the trot in 1976, 1977 and 1978 being the first club to achieve this.

In 1983-84 Tooting finished in the bottom two of the Isthmian League but were saved from relegation as Staines Town did not have the required ground grading.

However, there was no reprieve in the 1988-89 campaign when the club were relegated for the first time in its history.

In season 1992-93 Tooting won its first trophy for many years at first team level when they lifted the Full Members Cup, beating Dorking by a goal to nil, scored by Micky Stephens.

The 1996-97 season proved to be one of the worst in the club's history resulting in relegation to the Second Division.

By contrast the 2000-01 campaign was the club's best for many years as the 6th round of the FA Vase was reached and defeat only came at the hands of eventual winners Taunton Town.

Even more importantly under the guidance of Keith Boanas and Ian Hazel the Ryman League Division Two Championship was won despite an horrific backlog of fixtures.

After many years of frustration and setbacks the club moved into its new

home at Imperial Fields for the start of the 2002-03 season.

After going close to promotion in 2005-06, losing to Tonbridge in the Play-offs, manager Richard Cadette was replaced by the hugely experienced Billy Smith (who was skipper of Tooting's 1975-76 FA Cup side) and George Wakeling.

In their first season the club won both the London Senior Cup and the Surrey Senior Cup and a fantastic unbeaten league run saw Tooting reach

Sadly this proved to be a game too far as Hastings United won out by 2-0 at Imperial Fields

However, the 2007-08 season would see Tooting reach the Play-off Final again, this time against Cray Wanderers, and a Paul Vines goal resulted in a welcome return to the Premier Division after a gap of 19 years.

The club also produced a superstar by the name of Michail Antonio who came through the ranks and signed for Reading, and has subsequently starred in the Championship for Nottingham Forest and is now a regular on the score sheet with West Ham United.

In 2009-10 the team reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup after a gap of many years with a trip to Stockport County but in a torrential rainstorm went down to a 5-0 defeat.

Sadly at the end of the season Billy and George left the club and Mark Beard was subsequently appointed manager in May 2010.

After a mediocre first season and a dismal start to the 2011-12 season Beard was relieved of his position in December 2011 and former West Ham player Kenny Brown was appointed the new manager.

However, the results got worse and Tooting were relegated at the end of the 2011-12 season.

The following seasons saw a succession of managers (Roberto Forzoni, Jamie Martin and Phil Simpson) which cumulated in the club being relegated back to Division One at the end of the 2011-12 campaign.

For the 2013-14 season former Terrors captain Craig Tanner was appointed First Team Manager and was assisted by Adam Moriarty.

In their first season Tooting finished in a creditable 11th position.

The 2014-15 season again saw the Terrors finish in 11th spot and reach the London Senior Cup Final losing to Hendon, but at the end of the campaign the club parted company with Craig and Adam.

The new management team for the 2015-16 season was former Reserve Team Boss Frank Wilson as Manager with Mark Hams as his assistant.

In October Hams left the club to be replaced by Paul Dale who became Assistant Manager and First Team Coach having previously been a manager of the Army football team, also having served as Coach at Godalming Town.

Tooting ended the 2015-16 season on a high beating Hendon by 2 - 0 in front of a crowd of 480 in the London Senior Cup Final at Imber Court. 2016-17 was the pinnacle of Tooting's recent achievements, the club being crowned as Ryman South Champions after a superb season of entertaining football.

The team amassed a total of 105 points with 120 goals scored and won the league on goal difference from Dorking Wanderers.

They also broke numerous records on the way that included a 14 game winning streak in a run where of 15 matches undefeated.

Star men for the team during that campaign were Billy Dunn with 25 goals and fellow striker Mike Dixon with 23.

Manager Frank Wilson and his assistant Paul Dale were looking to consolidate that success in the new Bostik Premier division for the 2017-18

Paul subsequently left the club for a management role elsewhere and the Terrors highly respected U23 coach Ashley Bosah was appointed as Assistant Manager and Head Coach in his place.

The 2017-18 season was hugely disappointing, with the club in the lower reaches of the Isthmian league table for the majority of the campaign.

With only one team being relegated it was hoped that the club could get out of trouble but it was not to be and Premier League status was ended as Burges Hill Town pipped Tooting on goal difference!

At the end of the season the club parted company with manager Frank Wilson. For the 2018-19 season the club appointed Ashley Bosah and Cornelius Nwadialor as joint First Team Managers with Jordan Wilson in the dual role of Assistant Manager and Player/Coach. Ashley, Cornelius and Jordan had previously overseen the club's highly successful Under 23 side and they had a growing reputation of producing home grown talent.

This was good foresight by the club as attendances improved and there were many Football League scouts at Tooting & Mitcham matches.

There was also a general feeling of togetherness within the club.

After a cautious start to the campaign the team put up some tremendous performances going on several unbeaten runs which saw them challenge for a play-off place.

Sadly the club just missed out but the encouraging signs were there for all to see and that the future of the club was very bright.

The Terrors also made it to the final of the Surrey Senior Cup but went down to Southern League Premier outfit Metropolitan Police by two goals to nil.

During the campaign Tooting players Abraham Odoh, Isaiah Jones, Sam Folarin and Lexus Beeden all left to join EFL Championship Clubs.

Further proof that the club was in very safe hands with a Management team that would once again be at the helm for the 2019-20 season.

Hady Ghandour signed for Charlton Athletic in the summer before the 2020/21 season. Despite the abandoned league season in 2020-21 the club went on to win the London Senior Cup, beating AFC Wimbledon 2-1 in the final.

The win, under Cornelius Nwadialor and Ashley Bosah, was the clubs eighth win in the competition.

In this column we look back at a previous meeting with today's visitors Tooting & Mitcham United.

The first meeting between the two clubs came in September 1997, Darren Phillips' goal giving Northwood a 1-0 away win in Ryman League Division Two. Today's featured game was a seasonal opener in Bostik Isthmian Division One South Central on Saturday 12th August 2018...

Northwood's league campaign got off to a victorious start as Dean Barker's men staged a sensational comeback to stun pre-season promotion favourites Tooting & Mitcham

The Terrors settled well and looked the more threatening in the early stages, with their wing-backs finding plenty of space down both flanks, Billy Dunn going close with a rasping shot after good work from Danny Bassett.

But it was Woods who opened the scoring against the run of play as James Ewington applied a neat finish on 20 minutes to continue the goal scoring form he displayed during the pre-season campaign.

The visitors looked for a quick response and Northwood's lead proved to be short-lived as they lost possession in midfield, allowing Isiah Jones to beat a possible offside flag and set up Dunn, who despatched the ball beyond goalkeeper Luke Sheldrick for the equalising goal on 25 minutes.

Northwood were struggling to impose themselves and were restricted to long range efforts from Wilson Chingoka and Ben Pattie as the Terrors' marauding wingbacks continued to cause concern, and Isiah Jones went close with a curling effort before the overlapping Bassett's shot was saved by the legs of Sheldrick.

And the Terrors deservedly took the lead on 43 minutes as Jerome Slew got in a bit of a tangle as he looked to clear the loose ball, Peter Wedgeworth being presented

with the easiest of chances as he converted from close range. Northwood had a chance to regain parity with the final kick of the first half as Pattie's corner found its way to Ewington but the Woods' goalscorer scooped his effort over the crossbar.

Woods came out for the second period in positive fashion and they immediately threatened as Emmanuel Melford-Rowe had a good shout for a penalty award turned down after he appeared to be bundled over. The Terrors might have considered themselves a little lucky. and they looked to make the most of their good fortune as the increasingly dangerous Jones shot narrowly wide. At the other end. Northwood left-back Miguel Matos made a strong run into Tooting territory before sending his shot wide of the target.

Woods were beginning to make more of an impression and working themselves into some useful positions. However, they were dealt a cruel blow as they lost possession in the visitors' half which lead to Bassett applying an emphatic finish to a swift counter-attack to extend the Terrors' lead on 55 minutes. Northwood were rattled and their frustrations resulted in bookings for Melford-Rowe and Chingoka as a way back into the game looked increasingly unlikely.

Dunn almost put the game completely beyond Woods' reach as his fiercely struck free-kick hit a back stanchion. However, Northwood threw themselves a lifeline when substitutes Nyariki and Lucan combined to create an opportunity for Ewington, who sneaked the ball home at the far post to give the hosts hope on 76 minutes. And things got even better for Northwood three minutes later as Terrors' goalkeeper Liam Sallis made a hash of Pattie's lofted free-kick, skipper Carl Pearce the first to react as he gleefully headed home to restore parity.

Woods had engineered an amazing turnaround to leave the visitors shell-shocked, and now went in search of an

History-makers Northwood made it five successive away league wins for the first time since joining the Isthmian ranks, equaling a sequence they last recorded in the London Spartan championship winning season of 1991/92.

Woods came into the contest with one change from Saturday's win over Marlow - Sam Jenkins, still feeling the effects of the groin problem which curtailed him at the weekend, standing down with Ryan Young dropping into the right wing-back berth while Micah Jackson returned to the Northwood frontline.

On a chilly January evening, Westfield quickly warmed to their task as they tested Woods keeper Dan Hosier with an early Kai Hamilton-Olise free kick before Callum Abraham-Barlow rattled the crossbar with a fierce shot following Sam Evans' knockdown.

Northwood soon settled, displaying the confidence of a team which had won five of their last eight league games, Teddy Stacey firing a shot narrowly over after a good link up between Sydney Ibie and Andy Lomas. And Josh Helmore went close with Carl Stewart the creator, the in-form striker turning smartly before firing his shot narrowly wide of the far upright while another effort from the Northwood number nine just missed the target after a swift counter-attack.

Woods continued to press for the opening goal and a good run down the flank from Young led to his low cross just evading Jackson and Helmore in the six-yard-box.

Having enjoyed a good spell of pressure, Northwood were forced onto the back foot as the hosts created several opportunities with some neat, incisive play; Sam Evans going close before he created an opening for IK Hill whose shot was charged down by Tommy Boxer. And Hill was involved again as he saw his shot deflected behind for a corner while Hamilton-Olise swung a boot at fresh air when well placed.

But it wasn't long before Woods were asking questions again of the Westfield defence as Ibie had his shot blocked after a surging run into the box before 'keeper Callum Backhurst did well to divert a Keagan Cole free-kick.

However, after standing firm against a series of Westfield corners which saw Caleb Wright scoop over from close range. Woods took the lead in the third minute of added time at the end of an entertaining opening half - Lomas taking advantage of uncertainty in the home defence, as they adjusted to the loss of skipper Luke Elliot to a nasty shoulder injury, by sliding the ball through to Helmore who gave Backhurst no chance with a shimmy and a clinical finish for his fourth goal in as many games.

Northwood threatened again immediately after the restart as a sweeping move involving Young and Jackson ended with Helmore testing Backhurst who pulled off a fine reaction save to keep out the fierce shot.

But Woods' second goal of the evening was not long in coming. skipper Keagan Cole heading home Jackson's in-swinging corner on 48 minutes to register his first goal for the club. And Cole had another headed opportunity as he latched onto a Young corner, but slightly off-balance, missed the target. At the other end, Hosier had to be on his toes to gather a hooked shot from Hill.

Northwood's evening continued to bear fruit as they extended their lead further on the hour mark. Jackson's whipped free kick from outside the box on the angle flying beyond Backhurst, grazing the forehead of defender Niran Butler on the way through.

Westfield to their credit stuck to their task and they were rewarded with a goal on 70 minutes as Woods failed to properly clear their lines, Hill seeing his rasping shot rebound off the crossbar with substitute Ross Murdoch following up to convert.

Northwood made a couple of substitutions as the fresh legs of Alex More and Yiannis Constantinou replaced Lomas and Helmore with the contest moving into itslatter stages. And More had a hand in Woods' fourth goal as he made a foray down Westfield's right flank before squaring to Ibie, who was upended by Kai Davis, Jackson stepping up to dispatch the 90th minute penalty to complete the scoring, making it six goals in all competitions for the forward.

There was still time for Northwood to introduce 18-year-old Will Robinson, son of former Woods favourite Colin "Geordie" Robinson, for his first taste of senior football as a replacement for Ibie, the perfect end to an excellent evening for the visitors - the win, the sixth in nine games, taking Woods past Westfield and into 11thplace in the table and setting them up nicely for Saturday's trip to high-flying Uxbridge.




