Good afternoon and welcome to the Skyline Roofing Stadium and our C & G Scaffolding sponsored clubhouse for today's Pitching In Isthmian League fixture against Chipstead and we also cover our league game here on Tuesday against Marlow.

It's been a long time since we've had a week as bad for results as the last one!

Three defeats and whilst our performances haven't met the standards we have set previously, some of the officiating has been nothing short of woeful; one penalty conceded for handball here against Ashford and followed by two more at Hanworth. I've seen the footage and all three decisions are, in my opinion, inept at best. This was followed up by a 'goal' in the away game at Uxbridge that was clearly over the line and not

There is a lot I could write about regarding the running of a club like ours, which incorporates 29 youth teams, so if you can only begin to imagine the opinions and the politics involved, this may go some way to explaining why a recent survey described me as 'miserable'! I wonder why?

With these two home games in quick succession, we can very quickly climb the league table and re-establish nurselves as one of the better teams in the division. We also need to get back to basics and improve defensively to start with. Maybe this could be a better week? We shall see. I'm sure our opponents will be eager to add to our woes in what will be difficult matches so fingers crossed that we are back to our best.

Enjoy the games and let's hope for an increase in support to get back the levels we have been at.

Welcome to the Chips and the Blues

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for a pair of home games in the Pitching In Isthmian League over a four-day period which brings us a double-issue of your matchday programme for the visits of Chipstead FC and Marlow FC. We hope both clubs will enjoy their short stay with us and we look forward to our return visits later in the season. We were of course due to be meeting Westfield FC for the Saturday fixture but with those opponents having defeated Marlow in the FA Trophy a couple of weeks ago, they play in the next round of that (against Leatherhead) today and Chipstead. who were also without a game due to the same circumstances - they were due to meet Leatherhead: kindly agreed to bring forward a game originally scheduled for next March. The Chips made an excellent start to their league campaign with big home wins over the two relegated clubs Hartley Wintney (6-2) and Corinthian Casuals (4-1). They went out of the FA Cup, beaten 4-1 in a replay at Southern Combination League side Peacehaven & Telscombe while another Sussex side Lancing won. 4-2 at Chipstead to end our visitors interest in the FA Trophy. But their league form has become inconsistent with a 1-1 draw at Ashford Town (Middx) being followed by a big 1-4 home defeat against league leaders Raynes Park Vale and then, last Saturday, a shock 4-0 loss at struggling Metropolitan Police.

The bright spot in between those games though was a 1-0 victory at Leatherhead in the Velocity Isthmian League Cup and they now travel to South Park in Round Three.

Despite finishing last season six places ahead of Chipstead, the Wood

Despite Tinishing last season six places ahead of Chipstead, the Woods more than met their match in the two games against our opponents. Playing here first, the Chips ended our long run of winning home form when holding us to a 0-0 draw and in the return, they went even better, securing a 1-0 victory thanks to a goal from the penalty-spot by Jonathan Hood. Under new management this season, Chipstead's squad is almost completely different this time.

Marlow FC visit the Woods for the second time this season having been beaten 2-1 here in the Velocity Isthmian League Cup four weeks ago. Since then, they have been mainly involved in FA Competitions. Their fine run in the FA Cup came to an end in a replay against Isthmian Premier side Horsham. They had almost won the first game down in Sussex but had to settle for a 2-2 draw but the higher-ranked side came out stronger in the replay and won 3-1 at Marlow. After those two battles, similarly to the Woods after Cray Valley, they were disappointing in the FA Trophy and went down 2-1 at fellow South-Central side Westfield but they did bounce back to win 1-0 at Guernsey in the League last Saturday week and at the time of writing these notes, the Blues are well-placed in sixth place in the table with three wins from three since their opening day shock home

defeat against Thatcham Town. They

were due to play at in-form Southall last Wednesday night and at home to leaders Raynes Park Vale on Saturday so if they got good results from those two matches, they would certainly be very well placed in the play-off places by tonight.

It was a pretty torrid week, resultswise over the last couple of weeks. In his absence, Matt Messer performed well against both Ashford and Hanworth Villa but picked up a bit of a knock when adjudged to have fouled a Villa forward for the second penalty which meant he missed last weekend's game against Uxbridge. We were pleased to be able to draft

in young keeper Beau Hudd for his debut. The 18-year-old has been training with Watford FC since being released from West Bromwich Albion in the summer and he looked pretty solid, despite conceding four goals. It's been good to see central defender Romario Jonas get back to starting games over the last week after a long spell out with injury and he was named man of the match in our defeat at Hanworth Villa. Hopefully. he can stay injury-free as he works his way back to match fitness. Curtis Brown, who picked up a bad ankle injury in pre-season following his summer signing, has finally got a few minutes under his belt, coming on as a substitute a couple of times in the last week. Hopefully, he will gradually get more time on the pitch as he looks to establish himself in the side. Godlove Oppong, who is still to make his league debut due to a variety of injuries, missed all three matches having limped off in our FA Cup replay

FROM THE TRAINING PITCH

WITH ASSISTANT MANAGER, KEAGAN COLE



EYE-OPENING MONTH TWENTY NINE DAYS

9 Games, 2 Wins, 2 Draws, 5 Defeats, 21 Goals Conceded, 14 Goals Scored

A real test so early on the season for our new group with games coming thick and fast against some real testing high-quality opposition which has given us a real eye-opening experience with positives, negatives and a handful of lessons learnt across the way.

We began the month in good form, progressing into the FA Cup Second Qualifying Round following a fantastic show of character in the first leg and then a memorable lastminute winner in the home replay.

Then came Ramsgate, a real highlevel opposition who will for sure be at the top of their respected league taught us nothing short of a lesson in all aspects of the game... a professional ruthless performance.

Pages were turned and we moved onto cup games vs Marlow and Cray Valley. Again, two good level, well-respected sides where we fought and showed our quality across the board progressing in the Velocity Cup but falling just short in the FA Cup after two end-to-end breathtaking traditional cup fixtures.

Finally, after three weeks of cup competitions we returned to league

action firstly against Ashford Town [Middx] which was a game of real frustration... a first-half performance which as a management team we were really pleased with, creating plenty of chances and causing our opponents real problems but at the end of the day two poor defensive errors took us in at half-time a goal down with a tough forty five minutes ahead against an extremely organised side which we struggled to break down or create much.

A learning curve in our eyes and something to work on in breaking down a low-block who allow plenty of the ball. Next up came Hanworth Villa away, another tough, well-respected, opponent. Rectory Meadow is always a tough place to go to and we had a plan in place which had us in good stead for the majority of the game. But mistakes and complacency crept into our game and again mistakes were punished.

Most recently was Uxbridge another highly-experienced team. A game which we felt confident in on an Astro Turf pitch against a side with key players missing. A real eye-opening fixture which has answered questions that we weren't sure about. A deflated, quiet, weak and effortless first-half had us two goals down with a mountain to climb.

Credit to the boys' reactions after the break which gave us a real momentum push to get back to the required standard at Northwood Football Club and become competitive again.

However, a mistake and a handful of chances going unpunished led to us coming away conceding more goals and missing out on more points.

Looking at our next five league fixtures we are set to come up against some real testing sides with four of those currently sitting in the top six and will, for sure, be in and around those positions come the end of the season.

As a group we have plenty of work to do both on and off the pitch and there is no hiding the fact that our performances and results have been nothing less than inconsistent and the number of goals conceded is unacceptable with us currently averaging just over 2 goals a game.

We take ownership of that and will use those issues as motivation and a platform to build on moving forward and I can assure you that changes will be put in place where necessary.

Football is a real test mentally and in tough times leaders and support are needed in all aspects across the board and now is the time for us to see who those leaders amongst our club are.

We look forward to these two home fixtures and hope to get some points on the board.

Northwood secured their second successive away league win for the first time since March 2016 with a hard earned win at Chipstead, on their firstever visit to the Surrey club after they had been moved from the Isthmian's South Division

Woods went ahead on 14 minutes as Kyren Worrell capitalised on a mix-up between keeper Callum Hodgson and Sam Page to coolly convert from a narrow angle. And things got better for Northwood four minutes later as another back-pass from Page went through Hodgson allowing Ofosu to roll the ball into the unguarded net for his second goal in two games.

Chipstead had offered very little in a one-sided opening half but Northwood



gave the hosts some encouragement as they conceded a soft goal on the stroke of half-time, the unmarked Sam Bell flicking the ball home from a corner.

Leigh Stevens was instrumental in Northwood restoring their two goal cushion on 49 minutes when he broke forward before squaring the ball to

Worrell, who stroked the ball home for his second goal of the afternoon.

But the Woods had some defending to do as keeper Luke Sheldrick gathered a Luke Elliott header. However, the Chips weren't to be denied, as Northwood failed to deal with a cross from Clemo with Dan Moody converting on 82 minutes to ensure a nervous finish to the game for the visitors.



Teddy Stacey played a ball into the feet of striker Sydney Ibie and he steered a fine strike into the top corner of the net, giving the Chips goalkeeper Matthew Kerbey no chance.











It took 28 minutes for the Chips to finally threaten as first Dan Moody and then Kieran Lavery fired shots in from the left but both were wide of the far post. 



Within minutes it was 2-0 when lan Harvey finished off a good move between Robin Tidd and Roger Livingstone. Northwood survived a period of pressure but were well on top again in the second half.

Skipper Alan Merison made it 3-0 when he scored after breaking out of defence and Ellis made the most



of another fine midfield build-up to make it 4-0 Goal No. 5 came when substitute Gary Cooper headed the ball down for Tidd, who laid into the



path of Harvey, whose 25-yard drive went its off the inside of the post.





■orthwood's poor run of results continued as they fell to a third successive league defeat this time at the hands of local rivals Uxbridge...

There was a different feel to this 'local' derby with the match being played in the unfamiliar surrounds of Slough Town's Arbour Park with the Reds' return to a revamped Honevcroft being delayed by a couple of weeks.

Northwood threatened an early response with a Luke Tingey throw into the box which led to a lay-off from Jenkins into the path of Osaretin Otote who's shot narrowly cleared the far upright. But Uxbridge were soon back on the attack with Kai Hobbs sending a dangerous ball across the face of goal with no red shirt to apply the finish while Hudd had to show good reflexes to keep out a Tingev deflection from Andrew's cross.

However, Northwood were unable to resist another incisive Uxbridge attack


2-1 Dan Williams (56 mins)

CHIPSTEAD





hipstead Football Club was ■formed in 1906, when the Netherne hospital was being built, and the building workers and the lads in Chipstead challenged each other to a match.


The oldest club records dated 1911 show a far from healthy position. survival relying mainly on the proceeds of whist drives. The club's health began to improve and, in 1920, it even had its own transport for away games, an open topped lorry owned by a local builder. Up until the 1962/63 season. Chipstead played junior football, but, having finished runners-up in the County Junior Cup the previous year, they then moved into the Surrey Intermediate League The club played at this standard until

1982, when they became founder members of the Surrey Premier League. The next four years saw the club have great success finishing runners-up three times and also winning the League Cup on three occasions. During this period they were also beaten finalists in the County Premier Cup. The reserves also met with success being runnersup once and also winning the League

Cup. After a long battle, the club were awarded senior status in 1986 and were promoted to the Combined Counties League, where once again success followed; a League Championship was gained in 1989/90 and a runners-up spot was gained on two occasions, with six League Cup Final appearances, with Chipstead being victorious in four

Season 1987/88 saw the club make its debut in the F.A. Vase and the following year in the F.A. Cup. Over recent years the club has continued to grow and strengthen its youth policy with some 200 players between the ages of six and eighteen involved every week. Two former Chipstead vouth players - Leon McKenzie and Steven Sidwell moved on to professional clubs, &, more recently, Saidou Khan played for our 1st team. & is now with Maidstone Utd. The Combined Counties Championship winning squad contained no fewer than 12 players, who had represented the club at youth level

In 1998 Chipstead was able to purchase the freehold of the ground from the Local Authority. Thanks to a grant from the F.A. in 2001, the club was able to purchase additional land, which was developed into mini soccer pitches to further enhance its youth policy. More recently in November 2004 a 100-seater stand was installed, which was increased to 150 in March 2007. In May 2006 a covered standing area for 150 people was also erected

2006-07 was the club's 'Centenary' season, and the hope was that it would be a memorable one. On the opening day of the season, the team won their first game and went top of the table; come February, and still top, the decision was made to do the necessary work to achieve the ground upgrading. The next six weeks saw the ground transformed thanks to the incredible hard work of the committee and supporters. The team remained

top and promotion to the Ryman League was achieved for the first time in 100 years

In the 2007-08 season Chipstead established themselves in the Ryman League finishing a creditable 15th. They also went on to win the Southern Combination Cup beating Ryman Premier side Ashford Town [Middlesex] in the final.

In 2008-09 Chipstead struggled in the league, but, in the FA Cup, reached the 4th qualifying round for the first time in their history, eventually losing at Torquay United.

2010-11 saw Chipstead finished 10th being their highest position ever

2012-13 was a poor season for the club with no fewer than 4 managers - Mark Tompkins left the club after just one game; assistant Mick Read stepped in as temporary manager for a month, before the club appointed John Hamsher. Things seemed fine until January, when results took a dip. John decided to step down in early April, with vice-chairman Mick Ford taking over the reins for the final three matches

In 2013-14 Chipstead started the season with a new management team - Kevin Rayner, with Roly Martin as his assistant, and Mark Elgar as technical assistant. From August until the end of October 7 games out of 21 were won in all competitions, including losing both F.A. Trophy & F.A. Cup matches within eight days. Geoff Corner stepped aside as Chairman, with Mick Ford taking up the position. Mick's first task was to appoint a new manager in Steve Baker. A mid-table finish of 13th was a great turnaround for the club. Steve left the club in 2014-15, and was replaced by Simon Colbran

Following a poor start to the 2015/16 season, Simon resigned, and was replaced by Lyndon Buckwell. Unable to turn things around, Lyndon was himself replaced by Craig Tanner, who ultimately managed to save the club

from relegation with a few games to spare. Craig then left the club during the summer

2016-17 saw the return of ex-Chipstead player Antony Williams to manage the 1st team along with his assistants, two of whom had played for the club in the past. Having former club players in management gave everyone at the club a lift, and they quickly got to work, and comfortably avoided relegation. They laid the foundations for the 2017-18 season, 8 remain at the same level to this day, although the powers that be put the club in the Bostik League South Central Division for 2018/19

This provided many new clubs in opposition, yet Chipstead held their own in the division, although Antony decided to step aside, as the season drew to a close – his two coaches, Rob Kember & Rob Smith stepped forward to take up the mantle & now lead the club into this 2019/20 season in the newly-named BetVictor Isthmian League South Central Division.

Following 2 curtailed seasons due to the pandemic, Kember and Smith remained in their management role. We finished 10th in the 21/22 season, our equally highest ever position in the 1sthmian League. They are now continuing to build and strengthen the current squad for season 2022/23.

The end of 2022/23 saw the departure of the management team, Rob Kember, Rob Smith and Alan Tait after four years in the role.

The club were quick to appoint Dean Sammut in his first managerial role following a brief spell at Burgess Hill in a caretaker role alongside Lewis Taylor. Dean had been a coach for the first team over the past couple of years. He added to his team Lewis Taylor an experienced player and coach and Matty Males a past Chipstead captain. The squad is coming together and we are looking forward to the new season.

Dean, a UEFA B licence coach, was most recently Assistant Manager at Burgess Hill Town and has been involved with the Chips for eight years, steering their Under 18 side to success as Director of the Teknika Pro Academy. As a player, Dean was on the books at Crystal Palace before going on to play for Barnet and Sutton United. He has also spent time coaching at Selhurst Park.







KEN GREEN LOOKS AT MEMORABLE PAST MEETINGS WITH MARLOW

Winger Andy Reeder marked his full debut with a second minute goal and Chris Gell scored on his return from suspension on Woods' first league visit to Marlow...

The opening goal came when Tony Sibanda fed Terry Hibbert, who slipped a defence splitting ball through for Reeder to fire home. Hibbert was denied by a good save by home keeper Ian Leath in a one-on-one in the eighth minute as Woods continued to press forward press forward. They added the second with just 19 minutes played and it was a goal of genuine quality. Reeder put Gell through and the midfielder sent a superlative lob over the keeper and into the back of the net.



After the goal Ham fought back and a battle for supremacy in midfield resulted, with the home side coming out on top after their inside forward



Woods had a lucky escape when Thame caught out the defence, but could not cash in, and Ken Lavender saved the visitors with a great reaction save just before half-time.



remier Division side Horsham have taken full advantage of playing South-Central teams in the last two rounds of the FA Cup. beating Marlow (3-1 in a replay) and then Hanworth Villa 3-1 last weekend to take their place in the final qualifying round of the competition. They have been rewarded with another home game. though a much more difficult one, against National League side Dorking Wanderers.

At Step 4, only two Isthmian sides have made it to that fourth qualifying round and both play in the South East division. One is well-known to us as Ramsgate's narrow 2-1 win over Step 4 Southern League side Frome Town has earned the Rams a chance of a place in the first round when they play away to Southern Premier South side AFC Totton. The other side from the South-East Division is Sheppey United who enjoyed probably the result of the round - a 4-1 victory away at Merthyr Town. They will have to produce a similar result in the final qualifying round to progress though as they are away to Isthmian Premier Division Billericay Town who had an excellent 1-0 win over National League South side St. Albans City.

Billericay Town and Horsham are ioined by at least two other Premier Division sides in the final qualifier. Lewes had an excellent 3-0 win over struggling National League South side Hampton & Richmond Borough while Enfield Town came back from Halesowen Town, always a tough place to go, with a 2-1 victory, Lewes now face a real tough one away at Aldershot Town.

There are two other Isthmian Premier sides that were scheduled to play replays in midweek (after these notes were prepared). Carshalton Athletic were held to a 3-3 draw by Woods' conquerors Cray Valley PM and it will be interesting to see if Cray can turn them over in the replay to add to the sides from the South-East Division at the final qualifying stage. Heybridge Swifts would also have been surprised to lose O-1 at home to neighbours Witham Town. After a couple of mediocre years, Bury Town



t was a bad week for the Woods as Saturday's home defeat against Ashford was followed by this midweek loss at Hanworth Villa who were preparing for their big FA Cup tie at Horsham at the weekend.

It was penalties that again proved decisive with the home side being awarded two spot-kicks, both far from clear-cut decisions and both tucked away by Sam Merson.

Matt Messer continued in goal in place of the suspended Andrew McCorkell but Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway, Teddy Stacey and Kofi Anokye-Boadi all returned to the starting line-up in place of Carl Stewart, Sam Jenkins and Jaden Newman.

The Woods started the game well. A couple of early long-throws from Luke Tingey caused issues but a handball

claim was waved away and then Osaretin Otote was unable to keep his strike from the edge of the box down. The Villains hit back when Aston Nunn found himself in loads of space to run onto a quick counter. He drove forward and went for goal but Messer saved at his nearpost. Northwood then forced a series of corners, all delivered well by Deago Dunbar-Bonnie, but Villa defended them well as the Woods continued to hold the edge.

GOAL ALERT 0-1 Dan Williams (20 mins)

That edge was rewarded on 20 minutes when Otote pounced on a loose ball and sent a delightful first-time pass through for Dan Williams to run onto. The Woods top scorer showed a good first touch and then buried his shot inside the near post of goalkeeper Terry Buss.

GOAL ALERT 1-1 Sam Merson (28 mins, pen)

Things had been going well for the Woods until eight minutes later when a cross came in from the right. Messer was unable to catch it cleanly and pushed it onto Harry Gallagher. Though in a natural position, the ball hit the Woods defender between arm and body before he completed his clearance and the Referee decided this had to be a penalty. Merson converted with clinical precision and the home side were back in it.

Williams did have an effort on goal soon after this with a shot from distance that was always climbing too high but the only real chance was to Hanworth Villa as a well-delivered corner was headed by Kyen Nicholas from close range but Anokye-Boadi cleared off the line.

It looked like being all-square at the break but the Referee had other ideas. In the second minute of stoppage-time. another quick long-ball saw Messer come towards the edge of the box to clear while Nicholas raced towards him at pace. The Woods 'keeper was just there first, punched clear, inevitably collided with the Villa forward and most in the ground were shocked to see another penalty being awarded. Merson gratefully tucked it away and the Villains were ahead at the break.

As on Saturday, Northwood's secondhalf performance showed no glimpses of recovery from being a goal down at the break. There was a slow start but it was Hanworth who went close after 54 minutes when a quick throw saw the speedy Nicholas in on goal as the Woods defence was caught out, but he hooked his effort wide.

Northwood's only chance came two minutes later when Romario Jonas got a flicked header onto a Tingey throw but it was blocked and cleared. Newman replaced Gallagher to add a bit more attacking flair but it was Villa who had all the pressure, forcing a sequence of corners, one of which was headed wide by George Wells.

Into the final ten minutes, the home side looked to wrap up the three points but Messer made two excellent stops to deny substitute Steve Gody and then Merson who broke through one-on-one.

The Woods will be looking to pick themselves up and put a run of three successive defeats behind them as they travel for another Middlesex derby on Saturday against Uxbridge at the home of Slough Town with the Reds new pitch not being guite ready to stage it's first fixture.

orthwood suffered an FA Cup hangover as they slipped to their first league defeat of the season at the hands of their Middlesex rivals on a disappointing afternoon at the Skyline.

Manager Ben Bukowski was forced to shuffle his pack with several players still feeling the effects of the two keenly contested cup ties against Cray Valley Paper Mills - Teddy Stacey reverting to the bench with Harry Gallagher moving across to right-back and Romario Jonas coming into central defence. while Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway also started on the bench with Harry McCorkell coming into the midfield.

There was also a change in attack with Godlove Oppong dropping out while Jaden Newman was a late replacement for Kofi Anokye-Boadi who pulled up in the warm-up. Northwood were also

forced into a change of personnel between the sticks as Matt Messer made his league debut in place of the suspended Andrew McCorkell.

The Woods started brightly as they enjoyed plenty of possession forcing a couple of early corners before Osaretin Otote fired in a couple of shots which were comfortably dealt with by Ashford goalkeeper Toby Mawer.

Northwood continued to make all the early running as Gallagher played in Dan Williams who dragged his shot past the upright before Newman headed wide after Jonas flicked on a Luke Tingey throw into the six-yard box.

However, the Woods were stopped in their tracks on twenty minutes as the

But Northwood's relief was short-lived as the visitors were awarded a highly contentious penalty for handball against Sam Jenkins as he looked to clear a corner - Dasim Khan stepping up to extend Ashford's lead on 57 minutes.

Northwood were facing an uphill task if they were to get back into the contest and they rang the changes with attacker Curtis Brown making his long-awaited debut as he replaced Newman before Alexander-Greenaway and Luke Brophy entered the fray with Jenkins and Otote making way. However, Woods were struggling to create any real openings and appeared to be running out of ideas

as how to break down the well-drilled Tangerines.

MARLOW





reat Marlow Football Club was formed in November 1870 and so began the history of one of the oldest clubs in the country. In the last century the Club was a major force in the game and as one of the original entrants in the first F.A Cup competition in 1871/72 contributed a share of the £25 that bought the first trophy. In the very first year of the competition a certain Cuthbert Ottaway turned out for Marlow and just a year later he was to captain the national side against Scotland in the first ever officially recognised international match.

Marlow have the unique distinction of being the only club to have applied for entry to every competition since its inception although they were unable to compete once in the 1910/11 season. In 1882 they reached the semi-finals where they lost out to eventual winners Old Etonians 0-5 at the Oval. Two Amateur Cup semi-finals

and a host of Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins were among many honours won in this golden era. In 1894 Marlow rejected the opportunity to join the newly-formed Southern League in order to retain their amateur status and allowed Tottenham Hotspur to begin their climb to the top flight by taking their place.

The Club's ground until 1919 was Crown Meadow, now the Rilev Recreational Ground. An enforced move to the Star Meadow (which was unfenced) and the worsening financial situation resulted in the need to play in a more local competition than the Great Western Suburban League and Marlow joined the Reading and District League. This was a dark period for the Club and worse was to come when the Club's long-serving Honorary Secretary Alfred Davis. who had held office at the Club since 1891, died in 1924. It was decided that a fitting memorial to him would

be to provide a permanent home for Marlow F.C. An appeal proved to be very successful and the "Alfred Davis Memorial Ground" saw its first game in 1928. The picturesque grandstand dates from 1930's and followed the establishment of an Association who issued Share Certificates in connection with a Building Fund and was built to celebrate the Club's revival and the Spartan League Division Two championship.

Apart from a war-time break Marlow continued in the Spartan League until 1965 when entry was gained to the Athenian League Division Two. Promotion to Division One was secured in season 1970/71. Here Marlow remained until 1984 when they joined the Isthmian League. Having finished bottom of Division Two in 1985 the appointment of Mike Keen as Manager heralded a rapid rise in status. Promotion to Division One came the very next season and





then after just one season in Division One the championship was won and promotion to the Premier Division.

Here Marlow found things much tougher and Christmas arrived without a win and from a position at the foot of the table, a late season Houdini act saw them escape and secure their new-found status. When Keen left his assistant Dave Russell took over and good times returned. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won for the first time with a victory over local rivals Wycombe Wanderers and the FA Cup First Round was reached, for the first time that century, with an away tie at West Bromwich Albion the reward. Season 1992/93 saw even more FA Cup success with progression this time to the Third Round and a tie with Tottenham Hotspur that was switched to White Hart Lane where almost 27,000 saw the Blues give a very creditable performance. The Diadora (Isthmian) League Cup was won to finish the season on a high note.

1993/94 must rate as the most successful ever with Marlow again reaching the First Round of the FA Cup where a 0-2 home defeat against Plymouth Argyle was televised, while in the league a highest-ever position of third was achieved. The Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won again to round off a highly memorable season.

At the end of that season Russell left for Slough Town and took several players with him. A new squad and slow start left a lot to do in the league and relegation followed. In the F. Cup things were very different. The First Round saw Division Two table-toppers Oxford United defeated 2-0 at Oak Tree Road. After another home victory over Trophy holder's Woking secured a place in the Third Round at Swindon Town, who had been in the Premier League the season before, where the home side were grateful to progress by a 2-0 scoreline.

Season 1995/96 saw a finish in in eighth spot but the following season resulted in relegation. Graham Pritchard and Derek Sweetman took over for 1998/99 and provided a period of stability which saw finishes in mid-table. League restructuring saw them move from Division Two to the newly-formed Division One North for season 2002/03 where an 11th place finish was achieved. In 2003/04, Marlow were moved yet again to Division One South.

The reorganisation of the nonleague game saw them in different surroundings for the fourth time in four seasons with entry into The Southern League. Western Division for season 2004/05 and a finish in 13th spot. Kevin Stone had moved into the manager's seat towards the end of the season and enjoyed a great run. 2005/06 and in the same league and in more familiar surroundings seemed to suit the side and for most of the season they hovered around the play-off positions and eventually finished in 6th spot. A play-off spot was confirmed on the final day of the season and although a 1-2 defeat at Brackley Town followed the Club were pleased with the progress. Season 2006/07 in the South & West Division saw a successful run of results promise another play-off berth but a last day defeat at Winchester City saw them fall just short whilst season 2007/08 was a little more disappointing with some very good results failing to offset a poor run around February/March with a final finish just outside the play-offs following.

Season 2008/09 saw the Club moved vet again into the Midland Division and another inconsistent season followed finishing with a defeat to Windsor & Eton in the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup at M.K Dons stadium. The following two seasons saw some good results against the top sides but indifferent ones against the lower teams and ended with mid-table finishes even though a bright start in 2010/11 saw them briefly at the top of the table. 2011/12 did not start at all badly but soon developed into one where victories were very hard to come by and following a string of poor results long-standing manager Stone left just after Christmas. Assistant Steve Croxford took over and although performances and results improved

towards the end it was not enough to avoid relegation.

Season 2012/13 found Marlow in in the Uhlsport Hellenic League with a new management team headed by Mark Bartley eager to recapture some of the glories of the past and this they did. winning the league championship by a 16 point margin and scoring 123 goals in 36 games to return to the Southern League where the next two seasons saw them consolidate with finishes in and 17th and 11th positions respectively.

For 2015/16 Marlow were moved once again - to the South & West division - which again meant increased travelling and the loss of some key players and several local derbies, making life much more difficult and a mid-table finish was achieved. A return to the Central Division for 2016/17 aided a finish in 4th place (on goal difference) and achieved a play-off place, with third-placed Barton Rovers running out 2-0 victors at their ground. Season 2017/18 saw a mid-table finish followed by a return to the Isthmian League after a lengthy absence to take a place in the newlyformed South-Central division with a resultant reduction in travelling which is most welcome. Here generally good results saw them maintain a position near the top of the table throughout the season and qualify for the playoffs where they lost out in the semifinal to eventual winners Cheshunt 1-2 on their around.

Back "home" the Blues have settled in and despite the curtailment of the next two seasons retained the core of players and added some quality for 2021/2022 - a season that saw an excellent start and a position at or near the top of the table throughout, but a dismal run of results in the final months, lost the early momentum.

Last season The Blues went mightily close to promotion - losing to a lastgasp goal in their play-off semi-final against Hanworth Villa - but this young, hungry group - who have another year's experience under their belt - are well placed to challenge once again this term.






The Manager Mark ['] Bartley




