WOODS OUTLOOK

WITH ALAN EVANS

WELCOME TO THE ASH TREES

This afternoon we welcome everyone connected to Ashford Town (Middlesex) FC to the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium for our first meeting of the season in the Pitching In Isthmian League. Our visitors sit in fifteenth place in the league table at the time of writing – prior to their away game at Chipstead on Tuesday night – having picked up just one win and eight defeats from their last nine league matches but they have been suffering badly with injuries. They did well in the FA Cup earlier in the season, reaching the Second Qualifying round with wins over Uckfield, Knaphill and Tilbury before crashing out 7-2 at home by Premier Division side Folkestone Invicta. Like ourselves, it is in defence where the Tangerines have struggled most as their only clean sheet was achieved in a 5-0 away win at Staines Town back at the end of August. However, before Tuesday night, they have also failed to score in four successive away league games so would have been hoping to improve on that statistic in midweek.

In last season's much-curtailed campaign, it was this home fixture that was actually played and it was Ashford who took all three points with a comfortable 2-0 success thanks to goals from Steven Duff and Sam Humphreys.

The previous season, which ended in early March, did actually see the two sides meet three times with the Woods winning all of those contests. A Louis Bircham goal was enough to win a League Cup game at Ashford and we returned to the Robert Parker Stadium in November to win 3-1 in a League game with the scorers Harry Lodovica, Eric Lopes and Scott Weight with an own goal. Kevin Adjei had earlier netted from the penalty-spot for the home side. The return league game was played in early March, just before the lockdown and the Woods completed a "double" with a 2-1 victory. Max Webb had headed the visitors in front in first half stoppage-time but Northwood stormed back with goals from Ahmed Elshahib and Eric Lopes to win the game.

LEAGUE AND CUP NEWS

Having lost our last home league game 1-5 against South Park, the new management team was announced the following day and took charge for the first time last Saturday as the Woods recorded a 1-0 victory away at Chipstead. It was our first away win in the Isthmian League since a 2-1 defeat of Harlow Town under Jamie Leacock back on November 30th, 2019; almost two years ago and had been a

long wait of seventeen away matches. It was also our first clean sheet in an away league game for longer than that – a 1-0 success which relegated Molesey back in April 2019 so congratulations especially to Daniel Purdue and his defence.

On Tuesday night we travelled to play Combined Counties League leaders Hanworth Villa in the opening round of the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup and made it back-to-back wins over the past week with an excellent 5-2 victory. We made a powerful start to the game with Micah Jackson playing in a forward role and netting two goals either side of a Teddy Stacey tap-in that opened up a 3-0 lead. The home side did battle back with a goal either side of half-time to make it interesting but then two late goals wrapped up the victory and a place in the quarter-finals thanks to goals from Tommy Boxer and substitute Yiannis Constantinou.

NEW MANAGEMENT TEAM

We are delighted to welcome our new Management team who are in place here at the club with the experienced Steve Ringrose taking up the role of Director of Football alongside Ben Bukowski as Head Coach. Also joining the coaching team are former Woods striker Dave Lawrence plus two Player-Coaches in Keagan Cole and Andy Lomas, the latter another former Woods defender. Richard Elderfield remains in place to offer his experience at the club while recent recruit as Club Physiotherapist Dan Daggett (another ex-Woods player) had also agreed to continue in his role. We welcome the whole team and hope they enjoy what our club has to offer and that they all enjoy the experience over many years.

PLAYER NEWS

That management team all played their part in a very busy first week of recruitment which resulted in no less than eight changes to the starting line-up for that first game in charge at Chipstead last Saturday. As well as Keagan Cole and Andy Lomas, two other players arrived from Step 3 side Potters Bar Town in attackers Ryan Young and Sydney Ibie; Carl Stewart joined us from Beaconsfield Town; Tommy Boxer returned to the club for a second spell having had a few games for rivals Chalfont St Peter this season; Micah Jackson arrives from Enfield Borough while Teddy Stacey has been playing at Hadley. We thank all those clubs for making those transfers a smooth and swift process.

Since then, Yiannis Constantinou has started a third spell with the Woods having been playing for Egham Town this season.

We welcome all the new arrivals and hope that their stay will be a long and successful one.

It does of course mean that some of our former squad members have moved on. Adam Cash's parent club Hayes & Yeading had received a 7-day approach from Berkhamsted FC and he has chosen to join their promotion challenge. Ryan Avery has made the decision to join up with former teammates Sam Coles and Matty Ayres at Flackwell Heath; Declan Nche has joined Basildon United and Giovanni Palmer this week chose to join Bedfont Sports' promotion push after a 7-day approach from them. Arnie Linturn had decided a new job offer means that he can no longer devote the time to play at our level of football while Gradi Milenge has opted to look for a new club. We thank all of these players for their efforts over the last few months and wish them well for the future.

Go to the website www.northwoodfc.com and Season Tickets under the Commercial tab to pay online for yours or you can pay cash to me this afternoon if you would prefer.

You may want to consider becoming a 1926 Member. At a cost of £145, this gets you the Season Ticket but also a Player Sponsorship of your choice plus one Match-Day Sponsorship which includes hospitality for four people pre and post-match. These are limited but there are still a few memberships available.

Their game at Hayes & Yeading this week was postponed but they are back in action this coming Thursday night, 2nd November 2021 when they entertain Ashford Town (Middx), a side that they beat away from home on the opening day of the season. The Woods new-look side, under new management and with eight changes from the previous weekend, pulled off their first away Isthmian League win for nearly two years.

Only Daniel Purdue, Matt Surmon and James Gurteen kept their places in the starting line-up with six debutants plus two former Northwood defenders Andy Lomas and Tommy Boxer returning after previous spells.

And it was the Woods who were quickly on the front foot against a Chipstead side who boasted an unbeaten home record this season.

There had already been three forays into the final third, mainly involving Ryan Young, with one Keagan Cole free-kick being nodded well wide by Boxer, when the

visitors took a ninth minute lead.

Teddy Stacey played a ball into the feet of striker Sydney Ibie and he started his spell with the Woods with a quick turn of his marker before steering a fine strike into the top corner of the net, giving the Chips goalkeeper Matthew Kerbey, on loan from Sutton United, no chance.

Chipstead were struggling to get a foothold in the game with the Woods pressing well throughout the team and striker Andy Kabuikosomo picked up the first yellow card of the game for a late challenge on Cole after eighteen minutes.

It took twenty eight minutes for the Chips to finally threaten as first Dan Moody and then Kieran Lavery fired shots in from the left but both were wide of the far post.

But it was the Woods who finished the half strongly. Ibie's run and cutback almost set up Young but a defender just intercepted for a corner and then Lomas got forward for a shot that flew only just over the bar.





The home side knew they needed to change things and they made a double-substitution to begin the second-half. But it was still Northwood who were on top as another driving run from Lomas set up Stacey and his excellent strike had Kerbey flying across goal to tip the ball against the post and wide.

The context of the game changed soon after though as the Referee rather harshly showed Boxer two yellow cards in the space of ninety seconds, the first for taking too long over

taking a free-kick and the second for a minor foul and suddenly it was ten men for the last half hour.

Young was sacrificed to get Pablo Velasco on to bolster the defence with Surmon moving back into the centre

and within a few minutes Chipstead threatened with Kabuikosomo's header being comfortably saved by Purdue.

But the defence wouldn't be breached as it stayed solid to repel anything the Chips had to offer with just a couple of scares. Purdue earned his clean sheet with a great reflex save to deny Kabuikosomo again and a very late free-kick which was allowed to bounce in the six-yard box before finally being cleared.

A great start for the new regime and the Woods are back off of the bottom of the table.

This game started at a furious pace with the Woods doing all the attacking. Paddy Coburn and Steve Senior looked in fine form and their combination had the home defence at full stretch.

As happens when one team attacks non-stop, they tended to leave gaps at the back, and the Woods' defence, which has struggled recently, let them down again. A corner was swung over, and as six defenders watched, Victoria's lone attacker headed home.

Steve Pearce (pictured) set up the equaliser when he beat two players to give Steve Senior his goal.

Although well in control, Woods' defence often looked likely to submit to the quick break, and when a long clearance was played downfield, two Woods defenders completely missed the ball, and the home side's inside-forward had a simple task to score.

Paddy Coburn almost snatched the equaliser on two occasions and Barry Gould soared to head a great effort just over. When a defender tried to induce Gould to give away a throw-in near the home side's corner flag he simply slipped the ball through his legs to Pearce. He in turn crossed to Senior, who continued his goal-scoring form with a line volley.

Northwood should have had a winner in the last few minutes as they attacked furiously. Coburn had an effort blocked and Ian Harvey instantly killed the rebound, dummied the 'keeper, and rolled the ball goalward. But somehow a defender appeared from nowhere and cleared a certain goal.

Gary Cooper scored a brilliantly taken goal late in the game to give Northwood a good away point against Middlesex League leaders Mill End. Cooper had scored in both his games for the Woods since he re-joined them from Harefield United, and he has formed an effective strike force with Martin Ellis and Roger Livingstone.

Northwood were served a shock before Saturday's game when their ever-present goalkeeper Les Currell broke down with an ankle injury and Dave Russell had to take over. But Mill End took the lead before any of the Northwood side had

time to settle. A corner was only half cleared by the Woods' defence and Mill End's full-back Miles headed the ball in. The goal set Northwood into action, and Junior Jones had two good shots saved, and then had a header from three yards go just wide of the upright.

Northwood had gained control of the midfield and Gould and Merison were dominant in the defence, while full-backs Harman and Heslop gave little away.

But Mill End were not prepared to give an inch, either, although Jones had one startling run from deep in his own penalty area to well into the Mill End half but his final pass went astray. Northwood were confident that the goal would come, but they had to wait until six minutes from time. Coburn found the gap to squeeze a pass to Cooper and he took his chance majestically. The keeper came off his line and Cooper hit a perfect lob over his head and into the net.

A splendid 76th minute, 25-yard strike from Danny Yeoman (pictured) lit up this county cup tie. Boss Mick Harvey fielded a strong side, with the former Nationwide Conference pair of Warren Patmore and Ben Abbey starting up front. An early one-two between Patmore and Richard Morton led to the striker blasting over whilst the latter himself also skied an effort over the bar after fourteen minutes. The hosts threatened in patches with Adam Willis making some intelligent runs, although it was the visitors who had the better of a scrappy first half.



Lee O'Leary, on his starting debut, and Morton were combining well in midfield, and after 25 minutes the Woods should have taken the lead. Morton made a tremendous tackle in midfield before threading a defence splitting ball through to Abbey. The nippy striker danced around the onrushing goalkeeper, but his shot lacked any real pace and was cleared off the line. This let off seemed to spur on the

hosts and they had their best spell of the match just before the half-time whistle, culminating in a neat move which ended when Dayo Olufermi sliced a chance wide.

Northwood suffered their first reverse in the league under the stewardship of caretaker manager Scott Dash as they came out second best on the 3G pitch at Bedford Sports Ground.

The home side opened the scoring on 36 minutes, Charlie Postance powering his header beyond Sheldrick after he latched onto Tim Pitt's delicious cross with the Woods keeper caught in no-man's land.

Northwood almost posted an immediate response as Ofosu's cross agonisingly missed the head of Stevens with the goal at his mercy. Sheldrick was called into action immediately after the restart as he tipped a Postance free-kick over the bar. But the Woods stopper was left helpless on 47 minutes as Postance headed home his second of the evening with the visitors betraying their prevailing weakness at defending corners.

With the Woods pushing to get a goal back, a Bedford break-away led to Postance falling in the box under a challenge from Sam Jenkins with substitute David Pitt stepping up to dispatch the 89th minute penalty kick to seal the win for the hosts.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS... **ASHFORD TOWN (MIDDX)**

FOR MANY YEARS, IT WAS ASSUMED THAT ASHFORD TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB WAS FORMED IN 1964. HOWEVER, SUBSEQUENT RESEARCH INDICATED THE CLUB WAS FORMED IN 1958 AS ASHFORD ALBION AND FIRST COMPETED IN THE HOUNSLOW & DISTRICT LEAGUE.



Albion won two consecutive promotions to reach the Premier Division of the Hounslow League and were still competing at this level when the club changed its name to Ashford Town in 1964.

It was at this time that the club adopted its distinctive Tangerine & White colours. The club endured a difficult first campaign as the Town club and withdrew from the Premier Division, assuming the Reserve Team's place in Division Two.

Having rebuilt the club with a very young team, Ashford Town rapidly advanced back through the divisions of the Hounslow & District League, absorbing Staines Youth Club FC. on the way.

Several individuals from that era have remained with the Club and now form the backbone of the Committee.

The Club was elected to the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) in 1967 and promoted at the end of their first season.

The Ash Trees were League Cup finalists in 1970-71 and League runners-up in 1972-73. In 1974-75, Ashford enjoyed their best season under the management of ex-Fulham player Frank Reid, winning the League by three points from perennial contenders Merrow.

Prior to season 1982-83 an invitation was extended by Surrey County FA to become founder members of the Surrey County Premier League.

Ashford played their first match in the new league on 4 September 1982, drawing 0-0 away to Farleigh Rovers.

Almost from its foundation, the Club had aspirations to acquire its own ground and after one or two disappointments, this was achieved in August 1985, when

a long lease was signed with Spelthorne Borough Council, enabling the Club to move to its present home at Short Lane, Stanwell.

From what was nothing more than a field, the facilities were quickly developed, with the first match at Short Lane taking place in February 1986, following two postponements for snow.

Floodlights were erected in September 1995, whilst the pitch is railed all round and partly walled, with standing covered accommodation, plus a purpose built 150-seater stand, built in 1998.

An additional 100 seats were installed on the opposite side of the ground to this stand in 2006, after the club won promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division.

Runners-up spot in the Surrey Premier League was secured and with it the opportunity to enter senior football, as members of the Combined Counties League, senior status having been granted in May 1990.

It was at this point that the club changed its name to Ashford Town (Middlesex) FC, to avoid confusion with the Kent club of the same name.

During its ten-year membership of the Combined Counties League, the Club never finished below sixth place, and after finishing 3rd and 2nd in seasons 1992-93 and 93-94,

it went on to win the League Championship for four successive seasons.

It was a relative disappointment to only come 4th in 1998-99, even though the Club won the League Cup but a 5th championship in just six seasons was secured in 99-00, along with the Middlesex Charity Cup, the first ever senior county cup honour.

With the ground up to the required standard, Ashford took their place in the Isthmian League for season 2000-01 and by finishing in third place, secured promotion to Division Two at the first attempt.

In 2004, the pitch was completely relaid to include both irrigation and drainage systems, at a cost of around £50,000, mostly financed by the Football Stadia Improvement Fund.

The Club embarked upon new adventures in season 2004-05 in the Southern League for the first time, having been transferred over as a result of a restructure of the National League System.

The Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup was reached for the first time and Mark Butler, renowned goal scorer in his day with Aldershot Town, Staines Town and others was promoted from Assistant Manager to Manager following the resignation of Nathan Wharf in December 2004.

The play-offs were reached but resulted in a narrow defeat at Evesham United after extra time. In 2005-06, Ashford went one better, finishing second in Division One West of the Southern League, to secure promotion to Step 3.

This brought about a return to the Isthmian League for season 2006-07 and saw Ashford competing at their highest ever level.

The season brought consolidation of the new status with the added bonus of reaching and winning the Isthmian League Cup Final when Ashford triumphed 4-1 over Dover Athletic at Bromley.

Ashford built on this success, rallying from the foot of the table in November 2007 to narrowly miss a place in the promotion play-offs at the end of the 2007-08 season and the 2008-09 season saw Ashford begin the campaign in electrifying form, winning their opening six matches to top the table.

Mark Butler's side followed this up with a fantastic FA Cup run which saw them come agonisingly close to eliminating Forest Green Rovers in the Fourth Qualifying Round at Short Lane.

Ashford endured a difficult winter, which saw them flirt with relegation, before a late resurgence saw the side safely into mid-table.

The cup competitions added much adventure to the season, as Ashford followed up their exploits in the FA Cup with runs to the semi-finals of both the Middlesex Senior and Isthmian League Cups and end their campaign by defeating Conference Premier outfit Woking 3-2 at Metropolitan Police to win the Surrey Senior Cup.

The 2009-10 season saw Ashford make a reasonable start to the campaign, but the Ash Trees were shocked when manager Mark Butler tendered his resignation on Friday 23rd October, in order to take up the Manager's role at Margate, who were struggling at the foot of the table.

Ashford appointed former Leicester City and Bradford City midfielder Jamie Lawrence as his replacement, and the Jamaican international immediately led his new charges on a twelve-match unbeaten run.

However, issues off the pitch were causing problems for the club and a number of players, including leading goalscorer Byron Harrison left for Carshalton Athletic, where Mark Butler had accepted a coaching role after leaving Margate, where he had been in charge for just three months.

Ashford found scoring a problem after Harrison left and a dreadful run of form saw them go from the fringe of the play-off zone to battling relegation.

Ashford went into their final match knowing a win would almost guarantee survival but a heavy defeat led to relegation.

During the summer of 2010, the club were initially placed in the Central Division of the Southern League but were then offered the chance to remain at Step Three of the non-league pyramid.

However, as this offer was as a direct replacement for defunct Southern League side Merthyr Tydfil, the decision was made that the vast increase in travelling would be too great a burden for the club and the club elected to remain in the Central Division.

During this time, Bob Parker stepped down from his role as Chairman after twenty-eight years in the role. The club's home ground was renamed the Robert Parker Stadium in honour of Bob, who remains at the club as President.

Lawrence resigned as Manager in June 2011 and the club immediately appointed his assistant, Paul Burgess, to take the helm after more than 21 years at the club, including 683 First Team appearances.

Ashford finished the season strongly, winning two Cup Finals in 48 hours. In the Middlesex Charity Cup Final, the Ash Trees were 3-0 down to Northwood after 48 minutes before substitute Kofi Lockhart-Adams scored four times to put his team ahead.

The game finished 4-4, with Ashford winning the penalty shoot-out 4-2. Two days later, Ashford defeated Badshot Lea 3-1 to add the Aldershot Senior Cup to the cabinet.

The 2012-13 campaign saw Ashford reach the Final of the Middlesex Senior Cup against near-neighbours Staines Town.

However, Ashford were unable to claim the trophy, eventually falling to a 2-0 defeat.

An awful start to the 2013-14 season saw the Ash Trees cut adrift at the foot of the Southern League Central Division and former Youth team manager Ben Murray was appointed Manager and although results did not improve initially, performances and discipline did.

A rally during the final months of the campaign offered hope of a remarkable 'great escape', although relegation was confirmed at North Greenford United.

As a result, Ashford returned to the Combined Counties League.

The Ash Trees first campaign back in the competition saw Ashford finish third, while their second saw Town claim promotion.

The club's return to Step 4 was earned after Ashford finished second in the League, thanks to a remarkable end-of-season run which saw the Tangerines finish the season with 96 points.

This was 10 points behind the Champions, Hartley Wintney, but as 'The Row' did not then have the requisite facilities to play at Step 4, they could not go up.

Ashford's reward was a third brief spell in the Southern League.

A good start to the 2016-17 season allayed any fears that a return to the Central Division would see a repeat of the club's previous struggles, while a genuine highlight of the campaign was a third triumph in the Middlesex Charity Cup. The Final saw Ashford defeat Wealdstone of the National League to claim the magnificent trophy.

For 2017-18, what had been the Central Division of the Southern League became the East Division.

Awful weather made for a difficult season for all clubs and contributed to Ashford's campaign petering out into a mid-table finish.

A new reorganisation of the National League System sees the club move back into the Isthmian League as members of the South Central Division for 2018-19.

That season was another mid table finish with us also through to the Final of the Middlesex Charity Cup although just losing out to Uxbridge.


Murray then decided to stand down after his six-year tenure as first team manager.

The 2019-2020 season is the season that never was. We got part way through the season to then be instructed to go into lockdown due to the Covid Pandemic and the FA decided to expunge the whole season.

Season 2020-21 saw Luke Tufts step in to run the first team squad with Russell Canderton deciding to step down but Tufts never did get the chance to see the season through as The FA decided to curtail this season as well (however still deciding to do the full restructure of the FA pyramid).

PITCHING IN ISTHMIAN LEAGUE SOUTH CENTRAL DIVISION

Northwood faced an improving South Park in their first league game since the departure of manager Ben Murray, but it was a familiar story as they slumped to another heavy defeat.

Still under the interim management of coaches George Lavender and Richard Elderfield, Woods featured debutant attacker Mark Simuchimba in their starting line-up, while there were returns to the defence for Adam Cash, James Gurteen and Pablo Velasco.

Woods settled well and they had the first chance of the afternoon as Matteo Esposito's free-kick into the box found Gurteen, but he was unable to get over his header which cleared the South Park crossbar.

But the visitors began to show why they have been climbing the table of late, producing a series of incisive moves with good link-up play between forwards Ibrahim Jalloh and Adam Aziz with the latter being foiled by the legs of Northwood goalkeeper Daniel Purdue when clear on goal.

However, the Sparks weren't to be denied as they took an 11th minute lead after the Northwood defence failed to deal with visiting keeper Mo Otuyo's kick down the middle allowing Jalloh to knock the ball beyond Purdue who was caught in no-man's land.

South Park kept their foot on the gas by forcing a series of corners and went close to extending the lead. Jalloh having a couple of shots charged down while Purdue was on hand to save from both Jalloh and Aziz.

Northwood had a let off as Purdue's miscued throw went straight to Aziz but the attempted curling shot was gratefully gathered by the home stopper. But the hosts were not so fortunate on the 30-minute mark as more poor





defending allowed Aziz to tee-up Charlie Pitcher who made no mistake for the Sparks' second goal of the afternoon.

Shell-shocked Woods were struggling to put any meaningful moves together with a long-range effort from Joakim Ehui which was well wide of the target, the only moment of note before South Park regained their attacking momentum with James Dickson and Pitcher going close.

Northwood were forced into a change on 41 minutes as Gradi Milenge replaced Gurteen in central defence after the latter hobbled off with an ankle injury after Purdue landed on him during a goalmouth scramble.

Woods needed the sanctuary of the dressing room to regroup but unfortunately their half-time cuppas would have had an even more bitter taste as they conceded in added time as Aziz capped a fine first-half with his side's third goal of the afternoon.

The Sparks were immediately on the attack upon the resumption with Purdue keeping out Pitcher's effort. And having survived falling further behind, Woods made a rare foray into the visitor's half with Tecane Shrowder's ball finding Ismael Ehui in the box but his shot on the turn was blocked by a blue shirt.

And Northwood gave themselves a glimmer of hope as they reduced the arrears on 57 minutes, Cash playing a neat one-two with Esposito before feeding Joakim Ehui who shot beyond Otuyo for his second league goal of the season.

Woods made a second substitution as goal scorer Ehui made way for debutant Abioseh Davies with 20 minutes left to play. But it was hard for the substitute to make an impact as South Park threatened again with Purdue producing a smart save to keep out Leon Lalor-Dell's rising shot.

But Purdue was unable to prevent the Sparks from increasing the lead on 73 minutes as Matthew Faithorn headed home a corner with the ball deflecting and looping over the Woods' keeper.

The Woods were looking increasingly disheartened as the visitors threatened more goals with Kevin Rivera spurning a good opportunity. However, the Woods spurned a great chance to add a second goal as Ismael Ehui latched onto Velasco's whipped in cross but the header was at a comfortable height for Otuyo who tipped the effort over the crossbar.

And with the contest moving into stoppage time, South Park completed the rout with a fifth goal; the nature of which summed up Northwood's afternoon - Purdue playing the ball out to Cash who was dispossessed out on the touchline by Jalloh who returned the ball over the stranded keeper and into an empty net to complete his brace and cap another forgettable afternoon for Woods.

CLASSIC CLASH

WITH KEN GREEN

NORTHWOOD 4 ASHFORD TOWN 4 (2-4 PENS)

In this column we look back at a previous meeting with today's visitors Ashford Town (Middx). The clubs had met twice in the Evo-Stik League, each winning their respective home games, when they met at Grosvenor Vale in the final of the Middlesex Charity Cup on Monday 7th May 2011. The match merits the "Classic" title despite the ultimate outcome...

Ashford substitute Kofi Lockhart-Adams proved the hero of this Final tie at Wealdstone's ground, scoring four times in 26 second half minutes to turn the game on its head after the Woods had cruised into a three-goal lead.

The Ash Trees started quickly, with Ed Thomas feeding Alex Duffy down the left and his cross was headed wide by the diminutive striker Pietro Palladino. Shortly after this Mark Bitmead blasted over but Northwood soon began to make inroads themselves. Wayne O'Sullivan led the charge, forcing a corner from which he centred and a header was flicked wide. Then, after 16 minutes, Oliver Hawkins was fouled twenty yards from goal and O'Sullivan flighted in a superb free-kick which skipper Lee Grant headed on and past goalkeeper Paul McCarthy for his first goal in Northwood colours.



Romaine Walker was also testing the Ashford defence and latched onto a ball from O'Sullivan to get into the box and knock in a deflected cross which McCarthy took well.

After 25 minutes a quick break saw Spencer Bellotti slip and excellent ball into the path of Hawkins but as he was about to shoot, he was denied by a timely Jack Mullan interception who just got a foot in to prevent a possible goal.


Ashford rallied and after Harry Knock had blasted a shot well wide of the target, a corner tested Northwood goalkeeper Mitch Swain for the first time. He punched clear but only to the edge of the box and Dan Brown perhaps should have done better than just return the ball back into his hands. Just a minute later, Ashford were

presented with a free-kick just outside the box and Bitmead drove the ball at the wall with the referee turning down appeals for handball while Duffy fired well over from the rebound.

The Woods then grabbed a second goal after 39 minutes with a swift counter-attack. Once again it was O'Sullivan who made the attacking run from deep and he sliced open the defence to play a ball into the path of Hawkins who took one touch and then fired past the oncoming McCarthy.

There was almost a third goal just before the break when Bellotti broke through and saw the opportunity to chip a shot over McCarthy but the ball just cleared the crossbar and nestled on the roof of the net. But Northwood didn't have to wait too long for that "killer" third goal after the restart, and it was O'Sullivan who again continued with his own Man of the Match performance as his direct run took him past three defenders before squaring a pass across for Hawkins to score his second with a simple tap-in.

Still Northwood pushed forward and after 56 minutes it was Walker's turn to twist and turn his way into the box and his shot across goal was tipped just wide of the post by McCarthy at full stretch. Gary Meakin made his first substitution after 58 minutes, replacing Bellotti with the mercurial Rob Ursell but just a minute later the Ash Trees pulled a goal back when a scramble in the goalmouth saw Lockhart-Adams, who had been introduced for Palladino at half-time, back-heel the ball towards goal and it crept over the line.

Four minutes later Hawkins went close to completing a hat-trick when a sharp turn and shot flashed just over the bar but it also saw the Woods top scorer down with cramp and he limped off to be replaced by Garry Senior. Ashford replaced Bitmead with Somad Kazi at the same time and, for the first time, began to look the more threatening. This paid off after 72 minutes when Kwasi Frempong's misplaced pass gifted Ashford possession and when a quick pass put Lockhart-Adams down the left in space, the youngster cut in past Liam Fowler and blasted in a shot that crashed in off the underside of the crossbar.

Suddenly, it was game on again, and Ashford had the bit between their teeth with Kazi making a speedy run and cross from the right

which Fowler had to cut out with a timely clearance. However, the Woods still looked good on the break and another clever run and cross from O'Sullivan saw Senior slide in at the near post and he was just inches away from the required touch.

After 76 minutes Craig White won an important tackle just outside the box and burst through on goal. He unselfishly knocked it to his left to an unmarked Senior, who looked certain to score but his low strike hit McCarthy on the foot, cannoned off another defenders leg and then was scrambled off the line by a last-gasp clearance from Russell Canderton. It should have been game over at that stage but just three minutes later Ashford drew level. The referee played advantage after a foul on the halfway line as a ball released Brown down the right. He raced through and knocked in a dangerous cross which saw Lockhart-Adams neatly flick a shot past Swain and complete an excellent hat-trick.

It really was end-to-end stuff as Grant headed an O'Sullivan corner straight at McCarthy a minute later, but the onus was with Ashford and after Brown had seen his powerful shot come back off a post, they stunned the Woods with a fourth goal to take the lead. It was the two substitutes that produced the magic moment as Kazi lifted a neat ball over the defence and the ultra-confident Lockhart-Adams was straight through to skip past Swain and fire his side ahead.

The Woods gambled again by replacing defender Fowler with teenage midfielder Jack Hutchinson, and within a minute they were back on level terms. Once again it was O'Sullivan who supplied the cross from the right and when Senior's shot on the turn was pushed out by McCarthy, Walker dived in swiftly to head home the rebound. By now it was clear that anything could happen in the final few minutes and Ashford almost snatched it again when Kazi's run and shot was cleared off the line by Frempong and then a follow-up effort was well saved by Swain in goal.

A minute later Ursell tested McCarthy with a low but accurate shot towards the bottom corner and the Ashford 'keeper was across to save well and it was Northwood who had the last effort on goal deep into stoppage-time. Senior, looking to make amends for his earlier miss, seized on a loose ball in the box and hit a powerful and possibly goalbound shot but the ball struck John Christian and rebounded away.

So the game proceeded straight to a penalty-spot shoot-out, and it was Ashford who kicked things off with Ashley Lodge firing his side ahead clinically. O'Sullivan levelled things up for the Woods, despite McCarthy getting a hand to his shot high to the 'keepers left. Brown kept the Ash Trees in front with another well-taken spot-kick and then McCarthy turned the tie Ashford's way, diving to his right to deny Hutchinson's low strike.

There was no respite for Northwood as Duffy fired in a third but then Frempong showed his experience by scoring coolly for the Woods. It was 3-2 and still advantage to Ashford who then went further ahead when man of the moment Lockhart-Adams comfortably beat Swain for a fifth time. Walker had to score to keep Northwood's hopes of a first-ever Middlesex Charity Cup success alive but McCarthy guessed right and kept out his effort to win the cup for Ashford Town.

The Woods followed up Saturday's League win with a fairly comfortable victory in the Middlesex Charity Cup on Tuesday night, bagging five goals alongside a dominant performance.

Villa were struggling to get a foothold in the game as the Woods defence looked solid but there were no significant efforts on goal until the 36th minute when Jackson showed excellent skills to get past his marker and then score his second of the game with a low strike that gave goalkeeper Alex Brown no chance.

It was almost a fourth two minutes later as Stacey beat his man on the left and shot powerfully towards goal but Brown did well to get a touch onto the bar and the ball was cleared. Totally against the run of play, the Villains then pulled a goal back after 40 minutes as a rare switch off allowed Jordan Ellis to cut in from the left and even though he scuffed his shot, it was enough to wrongfoot Carl Stewart on the line who was unable to clear as the ball trickled in.

Stacey, with a quickly taken direct free-kick, and then Ehui both saw efforts just clear the bar as the Woods maintained their 3-1 lead into the break.

Jackson missed out on a great chance for a hat-trick after 52 minutes when a great ball from skipper Andy Lomas put him through on goal. He skipped past the keeper but with just a defender to avoid, he skied his shot.

Villa started to rally after this with Daniel Purdue saving from Ellis and just after the home side made a double substitution which brought on two more experienced players, they did narrow the deficit as Ben Merson headed home a deep cross on 66 minutes.

Yiannis Constantinou had already replaced Stacey and then Ehui and Esposito were substituted for Aaron Petch and Tecane Shrowder and it was enough to see the Woods back in control. After 81 minutes a young corner was knocked back across by James Gurteen and fellow centre-back Tommy Boxer poked the ball home from six yards.

Villa had a player sin-binned on 84 minutes – a rule being trialled in the Charity Cup this season – leaving them with ten men for the rest of the game and Petch forced Brown into a fine save soon after but it was just into stoppage-time that the Woods hit a fifth. Young was the provider again, dancing in from the right and finding Constantinou who hooked a shot into the bottom corner for his first Woods goal.
