Welcome to the Eagles

A warm welcome back to the Fenton Civil Engineering Stadium for today's Pitching In Isthmian League game against our friends from Bedfont Sports FC and we hope they enjoy their stay with us this afternoon.

The Eagles are still in with a realistic chance of getting to the end of season play-offs having hit a good unbeaten run since the turn of the year and, at the time of writing before their game on Tuesday night at Chipstead, like ourselves they are without a league defeat in 2022. It makes for an entertaining contest today for sure. Though Bracknell Town are well clear at the top, the next six clubs are all within a few points of each other as we hit the last two months of the season, all aiming for those four play-off spots and this includes Bedfont Sports.

That challenge has been based on a brilliant home record that Sports have been able to launch their promotion bid having only lost once on their own 3G pitch; a 1-4 loss to rivals Basingstoke Town back in late November. They also enjoyed a superb run in the FA Cup which was only ended by cup giant-killers Kidderminster Harriers by a narrow 1-0 scoreline back in mid-October.

Our own visit to the Recreation Ground ended in a facile 2-0 win for Sports with goals coming from Connagh Wilks and Charlie Postance, the latter coming in stoppage-time. It was then our ninth successive league defeat, we dropped to bottom of the table and it was the last act in the managerial reign of Ben Murray. Since then, we have improved somewhat and incredibly have won every away match we have played in the three months that have followed!

We have also already met here at Northwood this season as we inflicted the only defeat on the Eagles in 2022 when we came from behind to notch a last-gaps victory in the Middlesex Senior Cup quarter-final back on January 11th. Lewis Flatman put Bedfont in front but Josh

Helmore levelled in the second-half and then Tommy Boxer proved to be the hero as he pounced to score a stoppage-time winner. But, Bedfont did lose 1-0 to Chipstead on Tuesday night so their unbeaten run came to an end. In the next few weeks, the Eagles have both of the bottom clubs, Chalfont St Peter and Staines Town to play but they also face everyone's favourite opponents Marlow twice in quick succession and then games against Basingstoke Town and Hanwell Town before finishing the campaign against Chertsey Town and Bracknell Town!

League and Cup News

Two weeks ago, the Woods entertained Guernsey FC who made the long trip over from the Channel Islands and the two sides played out a competitive fixture which ended in a 1-1 draw that appeared to be a fair result to most observers. The visitors shaded a first-half which saw them hit a post early on but it was still goalless at half-time. After the break, Northwood looked most likely to score and then did that with fourteen minutes to play through substitute Sydney Ibie scoring with an excellent finish. What wasn't in the script was a penalty awarded to the visitors just six minutes later and they scored to grab a share of the points.

We then had our Middlesex Senior Cup semi-final against Barnet postponed due to the adverse weather the South of England suffered during that week – it has been rescheduled for this coming Tuesday night – before last Saturday's away game at Sutton Common Rovers. Again, there were plenty of postponements as the weather turned very wet once again but at Gander Green Lane, home of Football League side Sutton United, the pitch remained playable during the downpour and we were please to get back to action. The home side had made changes to their squad in recent weeks as they look to avoid relegation back to the Combined Counties League after just one season

and the game came on the back of an excellent victory at Thatcham Town for Rovers.

Keagan Cole gave us an early lead with a well-flighted free-kick – his fourth goal in the last six games - and after Sutton had levelled soon after, Josh Helmore converted an Andy Lomas cross for what proved to be the winner. It was our seventh successive Isthmian League win on our travels, an incredible run – Bracknell Town up next!

Then, on Tuesday night we travelled to play a Middlesex Charity Cup quarter-final at CB Hounslow for our first-ever game against the Combined Counties League side. On a difficult pitch and with several changes to the line-up the lads struggled to get a grip on things in the first-half but after the break, they got the all important first goal and went on to win 4-0 with goals from James Gurteen, Sam Cahill, Tommy Boxer and Kristian Belousas on debut. We are through to a second Middlesex semi-final and will await the draw in the coming weeks.

Player News

Joakim Ehui remains sidelined with injuries at present so remains three appearances short of 200 games for the Woods. Ryan Young also remains on the injury list having limped off against Tooting & Mitcham but could be available soon as could Teddy Stacey who was forced to sit out of games over the past week with an ankle injury.

Sam Jenkins made his fiftieth Woods appearance on Tuesday night, almost celebrated with a headed goal which was brilliantly saved, and then limped off injured at half-time for an eventful game. Lewis Batten also came off with a knee injury early on in the game but Sydney Ibie finally completed his three "County Cup" game suspension so is now clear to play on Tuesday night against Barnet.

Race Night

A Race Night took place in the clubhouse after the Saturday game against Guernsey and proved very successful. Our thanks to Andy Lomas and his family for running the night and to everyone who attended what was a very enjoyable fund-raiser.

Paul Masters' under-18s side were well in the game at Beaconsfield Town on Monday night for the first sixty minutes, coming from being down 3-0 to 3-2 at half-time and going very close to levelling the scores on numerous occasions. But when the home side netted a fourth, it was game over and then went on to fall to another heavy 8-2 defeat by the end. This coming Thursday night they play at home to Ashford Town (Middlesex) as they look to complete a "double" and get off the bottom of the table. I'm sure they would appreciate any support.

Spartans Youth (Adult Section)

The Spartans play their Middlesex Intermediate Cup semi-final against Middlesex County League side Brentham this afternoon at their own headquarters in Brentford. We wish them well as they look to reach the final of a competition that the Woods won back in 1978 by beating Feltham Reserves 2-1 with goals from Roger Livingstone and the late Alan Merison. They are scheduled to be back here next Saturday with a home league game against Staines Lammas. Kick-Off at 3pm and admission is Free as usual.

Resilient Northwood defied the stormy weather and a second half barrage from their hosts to extend their remarkable run to seven successive away league wins.

Almost eighteen years to the day since Woods' only previous visit to Gander Green Lane when they drew with Sutton United in an Isthmian Premier encounter, the excellent playing surface ensured that the contest was one of only three South Central games to survive the heavy morning rain and the effects of storm Eunice.

There were a number of changes to the Northwood team; the influential Teddy Stacey missing his first game due to the foot injury he picked up against Guernsey with Matt Surmon his replacement in midfield, while Alex More and Yiannis Constantinou reverted to the bench as Andy Lomas and Sydney Ibie returned to the starting line-up.

Northwood, with the strong wind at their backs, were quickly on the front foot and an early Lomas corner led to James Gurteen heading against an upright.

And the visitors worked another useful position with Sam Jenkins in an advanced position, but he delayed his shot and off-loaded to Ibie whose effort was charged down.

Ibie was running at the Rovers defence at every opportunity through the inside right channel and one foray led to the hosts conceding a free-kick on the edge of the box, KEAGAN COLE sending a delightful, curling effort over the wall and into the top corner to give Woods the lead with seven minutes on the clock.

The hosts responded well with the lively Jephte Tanga seeing his jinking run ended by a timely block from Cole.

And Tanga was instrumental in the equaliser on sixteen minutes as he evaded a couple of weak challenges before setting up YAO AZIAMA who made no mistake from close range.

Sutton were buoyed by the goal and Ryan Healy was the next to try his luck as he sent a long-range effort wide of the target.

But Northwood regrouped and Kyal Williams evaded a couple of challenges with a run into the box before unleashing a shot which brought out a full-length save from keeper James Dillon.

However, Dillon was powerless to prevent Woods regaining the lead in the thirty second minute, Surmon threading a lovely ball inside the full-back to the overlapping Lomas whose inch-perfect cross to the far post was met by JOSH HELMORE who swept the ball home into the roof of the net to maintain his impressive scoring record.

Woods came out for the second-half knowing they could expect a test with the unabating wind in their faces and Rovers went close to punishing some sloppy play from the visitors as they lost possession in their own half, Aziama dragging a low shot wide.

Despite struggling to get out of their own half at times, Northwood did manage the occasional advance into the Rovers half, Williams forcing a corner after another strong run into the

box while Helmore latched onto a loose ball before firing a shot on the turn into the arms of Dillon.

But Sutton kept up the pressure on the Northwood backline, Dan Hosier producing a couple of saves to deny Perri landolo and Ezekiel Bademosi while the former sent a free-kick narrowly wide before Tanga saw his shot deflected wide.

Woods continued to stand firm in the face of constant Rovers attacks, Prince Adeyemi the next to go close as he fired over when well placed.

Having survived a severe test of their defensive credentials, Northwood threatened to put the game beyond Rovers as Helmore broke clear before being denied by a superbly timed tackle from

Germaine Dua.

More was added to the fray on eighty three minutes as Helmore made way with Williams shifting across to a more central role.

And Woods went close again as the contest moved into added time, Ibie being thwarted by a smart save from Dillon.

But in the penultimate minute of the four indicated for stoppages, Rovers had their last chance to gain something for their endeavours as they were awarded another free-kick in a dangerous position, but Hosier was up to the challenge once again as he dealt with Adeyemi's effort to make sure of the points on another bountiful away day for Northwood.

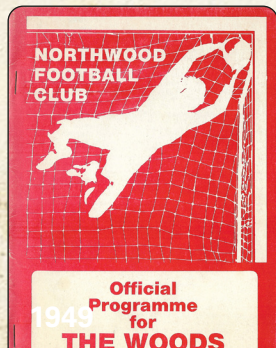
The feature of this game was a hat-trick by Bob Bell (pictured). At half-time there was no score, but later Bell and his colleagues got busy. He scored his second goal after beating four opponents.

The Woods defence was under pressure for the first 20 minutes and Doyle made a fine save from Micky Dingwall before Harlow had a goal disallowed for offside midway through the first half. Northwood, however, then began to show their best form, with Paul Rogan combining with Lawrence Holmes in a move that finished with Matthews shooting just wide.

Eventually, Woods went ahead early in the second half when a Delicata header, following a Holmes corner, was punched clear. Holland flashed over a cross and Randall took his chance with relish. Harlow were soon level, however, when an attack down the line was not

cut out and the ball fell to Marc Salmon, who found the corner of the net.

Doyle's absence seemed to make Northwood all the more determined, and soon afterwards a fine three-man moved ended with Dobson hitting a post before a Randall shot was scrambled away and a Coppinger effort saved. The winner, though, came with 10 minutes left when another good cross from Dobson was headed on by Randall for Holmes to crash the ball home.

BEDFONT SPORTS

Bedfont Sports Club was founded in 2002, when with considerable help from the local Council a lease was taken out on the near derelict Hatton Road Recreation Ground.

The only building on the site was refurbished to allow use as a bar and clubhouse on the ground floor and changing rooms on the upper one.

Most of this work was carried out or supervised by the Chairman Dave Reader.

Much work was also done to the playing area to provide playable pitches for Bedfont Sports on Saturdays and Bedfont Sunday, one of the oldest Sunday teams in Middlesex, on Sundays.

To give the Club a junior section Bedfont Eagles, formed in 1978, joined the two adult Clubs a short time later.

Bedfont Sports started in the Hounslow and District League for two seasons and then joined the Middlesex County Football League, this being a feeder League to Step 5.

More work was needed to enable the team to play in the Premier Division of the MCFL to which they gained promotion in 2004/05.

After many ups and downs promotion was finally achieved to the Combined Counties in season 2008/09.

In the Combined Counties League Bedfont gained promotion to the Premier Division in season 2011/12 and have spent the past few seasons consolidating that position.

During this time the club worked hard to raise funds to upgrade our facility to one of the best in Middlesex.

In 2010 we started work on Flood Lights and a new dressing room block was built together with a 3G five a side pitch and an 11v11 3G pitch along with over 750 seats in 4 stands on all 4 sides of the ground, which now complete gives us one of the best facilities not only in Middlesex but in the south of England.

Bedfont Sports is a true Community Club catering for 25 Junior Teams, a girls section, 2 Bedfont Sunday teams and our 1st Team who last season were promoted to the Bostik League and step 4 football

The Youth Section is particularly vibrant playing in the Bostik Youth League (currently Top of the Division) and having won the

Middlesex County Senior Cup back in 2015 and lost in last years final.

We are very proud that our Youth teams have been home-grown from Bedfont Eagles and with some real talent coming through this will continue for years to come.

A Club such as Bedfont Sports could not exist without sponsors so a big thank you to them and to the volunteers who give their time on match days and to the marking and upkeep of the ground and facilities.

In November 2020 we lost our leader, David Reader who passed away.

He left a massive hole in the club and our community which we are still recovering from now. David was a true grass roots hero, building the club from nothing to make sure children in the community not only had somewhere to play, but also have the very best facilities.

His legacy will live on through every Bedfont Eagle that wears the shirt and im sure he is with us at every game, kicking every ball and as he always said, trying to suck it in at the other end!!

THIS SEASON

Today's game is a clash of two of the current form teams in the division with our visitors topping the pile over the last six games while the Woods sit in third place.

Sports have made a terrific start to the new year currently having gone eight league games without defeat, their last loss came on Monday 27th December when they were beaten 3-2 at Uxbridge.

Since then though from their eight league games played, they have won six and drawn two, and currently stand in sixth place in the table just outside the play-off positions.

During the new year so far Sports only defeat so far came, here at Northwood, when the Woods won a close game 2-1 in the Middlesex Senior Cup.

Their unbeaten run in 2022 began on the 1st of January when they drew 1-1 at home with Chertsey Town and their next game saw them win a nine goal thriller beating Tooting & Mitcham United 5-4 in a game that saw them come back from 3-0 down

and 4-2 down at different stages of the game.

After their Senior Cup defeat, at the hands of the Woods, they returned to league duty with a 1-0 win at Sutton Common Rovers thanks to a last minute Lewis Flatman goal and they then picked up a point from a 3-3 draw at Thatcham Town.

Moving into February an early sixth minute Ricky Wellard goal earned three points over Westfield and then three second half goals gave them a 3-1 win away at Binfield.

Another 3-1 win followed, this time at home against visiting Guernsey, and then last Saturday four first half goals gave them a comfortable 4-0 home win over South Park.

In this season's Emirates FA Cup today's visitors enjoyed an excellent run in the competition.

Entering at the Preliminary Round stage they won through to the first round proper before going out of the competition losing 1-0 at home to Kidderminster Harriers, who eventually of course went on to lose to West Ham United in the fourth round.

In the Buildbase FA Trophy they reached the first round of the competition before going out when they were beaten 2-1 at Cray Wanderers.

Their best win of the season to date was 7-1 against Sutton Common Rovers and they have also enjoyed a couple of 4-0 victories beating both Staines Town and Thatcham Town by the same scoreline.

On the other hand their heaviest defeat of the campaign came at the end of November when they went down to a 4-1 home defeat at the hands of Basingstoke Town.

Ironically this is the only home loss that Sports have suffered all season.

The Woods defenders this afternoon will have to watch out for the goalscoring talents of Darryl Sanders who has twelve goals to his name, scoring six of those in his past five games.

With both teams in such good form today's match promises to be a cracker!

Ricky Wellard

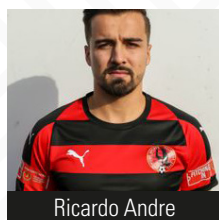
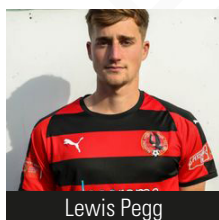

The Woods notched their ninth successive away win in all competitions with this eventually comfortable victory over Combined Counties League side CB Hounslow but they had to be patient after a goalless first-half which saw the home goalkeeper make a string of fine saves.

Changes were needed to the Woods line-up with Ryan Young, Teddy Stacey, Micah Jackson, Yiannis Constantinou, Sydney Ibie and Andy Lomas all missing but it was still a strong enough side which included a debut for attacker Kristian Belousas. Both Carl Stewart and Keagan Cole were given a rest so were on the bench. James Gurteen took over as Captain.

Kyal Williams was to cause the home side problems for much of the game with his pace and a run and cross after just seven minutes appeared to set up Josh Helmore but the striker's attempted flick at the near post failed to find the target.

Hounslow's first effort on goal came four minutes later from Victor Montes as he went for goal from distance and Dan Hosier had to be alert to palm it over the crossbar to safety. From that corner, a defensive header failed to clear and Hosier again had to punch clear under pressure.

Young Lewis Batten was forced off early with a knee injury and was replaced by Sam Cahill in the right wing-back position and the Woods continued to dominate play. CB goalkeeper Harry Churchill made the first of his saves

on twenty one minutes as he got down low to keep out a Williams effort and four minutes later, he got across to make a fine save from Sam Jenkins diving-header as he met an Alex More free-kick.

More was next to test Churchill with another low shot which was well saved and then the home custodian made the best save of the lot on the half-hour when Helmore found Jenkins in the box and his strike was acrobatically tipped over the bar.

The 'keeper wasn't so sure with a Williams drive across goal on thirty five minutes as he spilled his cross-shot and Belousas was onto it but his first-time shot came back off the near-post and rebounded clear. Williams went close soon after and the half ended with Cahill driving in a cross which just eluded both Helmore and Williams in the middle.

Jenkins' 50th appearance for the Woods came to an end at half-time as he hobbled off to be replaced by Cole and almost immediately from kick-off, Hounslow had their best chance as a loose ball fell to William Braved but he chipped the ball well over the bar.

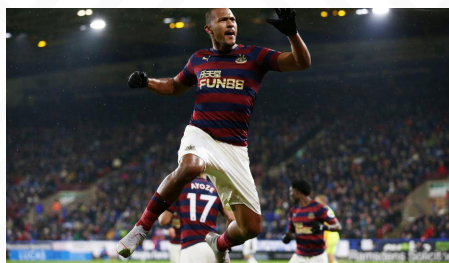

CLASSIC CLASH

In this column we look back at a previous meeting with today's visitors Bedfont Sports. Our featured game comes from 2018-19, the first season that the clubs played in the same division.

Northwood made it three league wins out of four as they staged a stunning second half comeback to overhaul a two goal deficit and gain revenge for the defeat suffered at the hands of Bedfont back in November.

Woods started well as Chris Gosling's through-ball sent Kweku Lucan clear but the latter snatched at his shot and failed to trouble keeper Matte Pierson. But the early optimism faded as the Eagles took a 7th minute lead through Perry Luckins as he headed home a cross after a partially cleared corner.

The home side went close to posting a quick riposte as a Matos free-kick picked out Carl Pearce, whose headed pass found Jenkins but his stretching header was wide of the target.

Northwood were strangely subdued as the blustery conditions were increasingly favouring the visitors and they pinned the hosts back as Luckins and Abdul Abdeen went close before the aforementioned pair combined but Luke Sheldrick was quickly off his line to smother the danger.

However, Sheldrick was left helpless on 31 minutes as Abdeen's deflected cross caught the wind and flew over the Northwood stopper to give Bedfont a two goal advantage.

Woods had struggled to make much of an impression in attack but they finished the opening period with a couple of half chances as Jenkins headed wide from a Tremayne Charles free-kick before the latter had his close-range shot charged down after good work from Dan Pett.

No doubt some stern words were spoken during the

half-time break, and they looked to have had the desired effect as Northwood looked a different proposition upon the resumption.

Woods immediately threatened the Eagles' goal through Pett and Lucan as they launched a series of incisive attacks. And it was no surprise as Northwood reduced the arrears on 52 minutes as Charles got round the back of the Eagles defence before squaring to Alex Witham, who finished with ease.

The home side made a change just after the hour, with Zaid Sabti replacing Pett as the hosts continued to look for the equaliser. Charles was proving a constant thorn in Bedfont's side and he created an opportunity for Witham, who miscued his shot before the latter spun smartly on a Asumadu-Sakyi pass and drew a fingertip save from Pierson.

Northwood kept up the pressure and they deservedly drew level on 71 minutes as Pierson was penalised for obstructing the on-rushing Charles, Witham converting from the penalty spot for his fifth goal in Woods colours. Kyran Worrell was introduced for Charles as Northwood searched for the winning goal and the substitute was almost in as he ran onto a Sabti through-ball but was denied by a last-ditch tackle.

But Woods were not to be denied and in the second minute of added time Sabti ran onto Gosling's defence-splitting pass before calmly dispatching the ball beyond Pierson to complete the turnaround and put the seal on the proverbial 'game of two halves'.
