Enjoy the game Woods fans, and let's keep the noise up!



Last Saturday, our long trip to Ramsgate who, like Cray Valley, are amonast the favourites for the South-East Division title, proved a difficult one and we exited the Isuzu FA Trophy at the first stage as we were beaten 3-0 by the Kent coast side. On a sweltering day, the home side were quickly on the front foot in front of a big crowd on their 3G pitch. They had already threatened before Luke Tingey was forced off with an early injury and the Rams turned the screw with a goal just two minutes later. Andrew McCorkell was in good form

again, keeping out several efforts on goal while the crossbar and Teddy Stacey also came to our rescue but two quick goals just before the halftime interval killed any hopes of a second-half comeback.

The Woods bounced back on Tuesday night when we took on Marlow in the Velocity Isthmian League Cup. 
Both Teddy Stacey and Riccardo Alexander-Greenaway have reached 49 appearances so could reach the 50-game milestone this afternoon.






Woods kept pressing forward in the second half, thanks to tireless work by Chris Gell, while Lawrence Holmes' vision and touch was an inspiration.

orthwood's trip to the Kent coast ended in disappointment as they exited the Trophy at the first hurdle on a sweltering afternoon at the Southwood Stadium.

Following a tortuous journey and a delayed kick-off due to the match officials also being caught up in heavy traffic, Woods took to the 3G pitch with Harry McCorkell reinstated to the midfield as Luke Brophy reverted to the bench, the only change from the team which started Tuesday's F.A. Cup replay success over Binfield.

Woods were on the back foot from the start as Tijan Jadama went close before goalkeeper Andrew McCorkell kept out a close-range attempt from Bodi Anidugbe while experienced striker Joe Taylor crashed a shot against the crossbar.

And things were made considerably more difficult for the visitors as they lost influential skipper Luke Tingev to injury with only ten minutes on the clock with Romario Jonas his replacement.

Northwood barely had time to readjust as the lively Benni Bioletti sent over a cross which was converted by Medy Elito at the far post to give the Rams the lead on 13 minutes. And the hosts threatened further goals as 'keeper McCorkell produced a couple for fine saves to keep out Alfie Paxman and Taylor.

Northwood gradually found their feet as Kofi Anokye-Boadi cut in from the right flank before shooting narrowly over. And Harry Gallagher went close to adding to his recent goal tally after he was picked out by Teddy Stacey's deep far cross as the Rams failed to clear their lines from a Jonas throw into the box, the defender's shot curling over the far stanchion.

Woods continued to probe as Deago Dunbar-Bonnie released Osaretin Otote whose low cross almost reached the onrushing Anokve-Boadi but was diverted behind by a covering defender.

But having forced a couple of corners, Woods then had some more defending to do as Taylor thought he had increased his side's lead as he poked the ball beyond McCorkell only to see the covering Stacey hook the ball off the line.

However, having done well to keep themselves in the contest, Northwood's hopes were dashed as they conceded two goals before the half-time break - goalkeeper Tom Hadler's long kick picking out Jadama who got beyond Stacey and delivered an emphatic finish nn 41 minutes

Northwood remained unchanged for the second period and the Rams almost compounded the visitor's misery as possession was squandered in the middle of the park enabling Bioletti to surge forward with his initial shot being kept out by McCorkell before his followup effort rebounded off the upright.

To their credit, Woods refused to throw in the towel, and they proceeded to play with purpose and moving the ball around well as they looked to retrieve something from the game - Dan Williams with a couple of long-range attempts.

Northwood made a change just before the hour as Harry McCorkell made way for Sam Jenkins to freshen up the midfield. But the Rams continued. to threaten on the break as McCorkell denied Taylor once again before Jonas cleared a goal-bound effort from Jadama.

Left-back Brophy was added to the fray in place of Otote on 69 minutes with Dunbar-Bonnie pushing on and Woods continued to enjoy plenty of possession without truly threatening - Jenkins' audacious long-range attempt dropping wide after spotting Hadler off his line while Dunbar-Bonnie almost latched onto a searching cross from Brophy

who had a shot of his own from distance which found the side-netting.

However. Northwood were unable to find the consolation which their second half performance deserved with Hadler's parrying of a Gallagher free kick with Jenkins almost latching onto the rebound, the closest the visitors came before the curtain closed on Woods' FA Trophy hopes for another year.

The Urchins, who made a shock decision to remove manager Mark Stimson at the end of last season after losing in the play-offs and replacing him with former Cardiff City boss Steve Morison, are unbeaten so it seems a good move for the Essex club so far.

Carshalton Athletic are right up there too following their 2-0 victory over

relegated Concord Rangers who are one of two sides still looking for their first point of the season.




If much-fancied Billericay Town had played and won they would probably

Their FA Trophy game with Walthamstow was postponed as the club come to terms with their huge loss and since then Manager Jamie Cureton and his staff, plus several players have also left the club.

It remains to be seen how they continue to operate following their promotion from the Essex Senior League last season.






This was Northwood's first appearance at this stage of the competition, but a gap of three divisions proved too much for them.

Rothwell hit back immediately this time, sub Mickey Moore calmly lifting the ball over Dawson.



other clubs are equalling their best Cup run ever. For Farnham Town this is only the second time the club has made it this far in 34 campaigns, the last time being 24 years ago.

of the eighty ties involve clubs that have met in FA Cup before with Carshalton Athletic versus Kingstonian FC having happened the most in the past both having beaten each other four times in their previous 8 meetings.

years is the longest wait of the round to avenue a past Cup defeat when Boston United lost 3-2 to AP Leamington in 1977/78 season (unless Workington AFC losing 1-0 against Darlington FC three years earlier counts as the same two clubs meeting again). And Gorleston FC have potential revenge of sorts having lost 3-0 at original Bedford Town 70 years ago.

more goal is all that Kettering Town need in their home match against Sporting Khalsa to regain the record of the competition's overall top scoring club.

ecords held by Kent FA show that Cray Valley Paper Mills FC (CVPM) was founded in 1919 - the team originally playing in green and white, matching the livery of the paper mills vehicles and company banner - and was supported by the Nash family who owned the paper mills until its closure in 1981

Playing in the newly formed Sidcup and Kent League Division 2, the Club's first match was a 1-0 victory against Hamilton House FC on September 20th 1919, followed by a 7-0 victory in our first away match at Sidcup Invicta. CVPM went on to win the division in their first season - gaining promotion to the Bromlev & District League Division 1. The following season they were again champions - also winning

the Kent County Junior Cup, defeating Sittingbourne Paper Mills 3-0 in the Final. Their next success came as members of the Kent Amateur League Western Section in 1932/33 - winning the Divisional title that season before finishing runners-up in 1936/37.

Records between the late-fifties and the early-seventies are scarce, until 1975 when CVPM joined the South London Alliance League, winning Division 1 in 1979/80 and the Premier Division in 1980/81 - their final season playing at the sports ground of the mills at St Pauls Cray in Kent.

Following a "nomadic existence" CVPM arrived at their present home at Badgers Sports Ground in Middle Park Avenue, Eltham for the season


1998/99, when "Paper Mills" was abbreviated to "(PM)" in the Club's

The Club continued to enjoy success in the South London Alliance - winning Division 1 in 1983/84 and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1988/89 - before joining the Spartan League, gaining promotion to Division 1 in 1990/91 by finishing as runners up, only missing out on the title on goal difference. They moved to the re-structured Spartan Midland League in 1997/98, - finishing as runners up in their first season - and became founder members of the London Intermediate League - reaching the Final of the League Cup in 1998/99 - before, under the management of Mark Edwards, being elected









to Division One of the Kent County League in 2001/02.

During Edwards' reign, CVPM enjoyed regular success - winning Division 1 West in 2002/03 before winning the Premier Division by 11 points in 2004/05. They were also victorious in the London Intermediate Cup in 2003. 2004, 2010 and 2011.

Willie O'Sullivan became manager in season 2009/10, before leaving in January of the following season 2011/12, at the end of which the Club effectively gained two "promotions"moving from the "Step 7" Kent County League to the "Step 5" Kent League

With Steve Chapman then taking over at the helm, their first season at that level saw them finish in a highly creditable 11th position while the following two seasons saw further progress, with 8th and 7th placed finishes, while reaching the semi-final of the London Senior Cup - narrowly losing to eventual winners AFC Wimbledon.

2012/13 saw their debut in the FA Vase, followed by a first appearance in the FA Cup the following season - beating Lancing away in a replay, before losing to Redhill in the Preliminary round.

After Paul Gross took over from Chapman for the 2014/15 season, The Millers finished 7th in the newly named Southern Counties East Football League (SCEFL) - a late season slump resulting in a disappointing 10th place finish the following season.

Under James Collins, the 2016/17 campaign saw the Club finish in a very creditable 4th place in the league, and reach the Final of the Kent Senior Trophy - losing 2-1 to League Champions Ashford Town. They also became the lowest ranked team ever to win the London Senior Cup when, on a memorable night at Dulwich Hamlet. The Millers beat Ryman Premier Division opponents Metropolitan Police 2-1. It was also

a successful season for the Club's vounasters - the Reserves winning the Suburban League South Division before losing to Metropolitan Police Reserves in the League Cup Final.

Kevin Watson was appointed as manager early in the 2017/18 campaign, guiding The Millers to 6th place, while again reaching the final of the London Senior Cup - on this occasion being beaten by Balham.

The centenary season 2018/19 saw the Club again scale new heights winning the SCEFL title by a single point, accruing 91 points from 38 matches while scoring 108 goals with a goal difference of +72, and securing promotion to the Isthmian League. The Club also made their first appearance at Wembley - Combined Counties League side Chertsey Town beating Valley 3-1 after extra time in the FA Vase Final in front of a crowd of 42.962.

Their first season in the Isthmian League South East Division (Step 4) came to a premature end due to the Covid-19 outbreak, as they were in 3rd position off the back of a run of eight consecutive victories and looking set to challenge for further promotion.

While the 2020/21 season was also curtailed in December 2020 due to Covid-19, there was still time for The Millers to embark on a record breaking run in the FA Cup. Progress to the First Round Proper will live long in the memory - in particular a famous 3-2 victory at National League side Maidenhead United in the Fourth Round Qualifying.

Season 2021/22 finally saw The Millers complete a full season at step 4, achieving their highest ever finish in 5th place to secure a play off spot - a 1-O defeat in the semi-final at Ashford United ending any promotion hopes.

Following Kevin Watson's departure in November 2022, his assistant Tommy Osborne took over the reigns and continued to gain plaudits for a pleasing on the eye passing game

but narrowly missed out on a play off spot, finishing in 6th place, A new era now beckons with a complete managerial change in preparation for the coming 2023/24 season with the appointment of Steve McKimm and Barry Moore.

The club continues to operate a thriving youth section which saw both its Isthmian Youth U18's and Kent Youth league U16's crowned champions of their respective divisions for season 2022/23 under their managers Graham Knight and Steve Axam.

The Manager Steve Mckimm



Steve was appointed Cray Valley first team manager at the beginning of June 2023 bringing with him his assistant Barry Moore. They had worked together at Tonbridge Angels for eight years and last season at Carshalton Athletic. The managerial duo of McKimm and Moore guided the Angels to an Isthmian League Premier Division play-off semi-final spot in 2015/16 before promotion to the National League South was secured via the Isthmian Premier play-offs in 2018/19.









SAM FREEMAN

Goalkeeper Sam became one of manager Steve Mckimm's first signings after joining Valley in June 2023. Sam now age 32 made 11 appearances for Whitehawk last season after joining from East Grinstead.at the beginning of February 2023. At the start of his career, Sam played for Horsham YMCA in the Isthmian South in season 2010/11. Among his former clubs he also counts South Park. Three Bridges and Haywards Heath Town.

CLEMENT ASIEDU

Clement now age 20 a left sided defender joined Valley in July 2023 from Horsham YMCA where he made 52 appearances including 34 last season in the Southern Combination



premier division at step 5. A product of the Volenti Academy he represented Crystal Palace as a youth player.

JULIEN ANAU

Born and brought up in Paris, Julien now 29 has played in France, Spain and Ireland as well as spending time at English clubs Queens Park Rangers. Whitehawk, Dover Athletic and Welling United, After suffering a number of injuries and having a period out of the game the midfielder joined the Millers in October last year, making 24 appearances, scoring the one goal.

SONNY BLACK

Former Crystal Palace youngster Sonny joined The Millers in July 2022 making 44 appearances scoring 5 goals last season and winning Managers Player of the Year. The 27 vear old central midfielder joined from VCD Athletic and previously spent two seasons at Westfield after winning promotion from the Isthmian League South East Division with Walton Casuals in 2017/18

TOM CHAMBERS

Left sided defender / wing back Tom ioined The Millers in the summer of 2022 making 42 appearances scoring 5 goals. He joined from SCEFL Division 1 side Lewisham Borough after a spell at Whyteleafe. The 22 year old was a youth team graduate at Dulwich Hamlet - winning the Player of the Year award in 2018/19 before joining Fisher on loan.

ADAM COOMBES

Signed for Valley in the summer of 2022 Adam now 32 years old made 41 appearances scoring 15 goals last season. A product of the Chelsea academy and former England Under 16 striker Adam joined from Tonbridge Angels. During a career disrupted by injury, Adam has enjoyed goalscoring success at Welling United and Billericay Town among others

LYLE DELLA-VERDE

Versatile attacking player, now 28. who joined Valley in July 2023 from Isthmian Premier side Enfield Town where over two spells he made 102 appearance for the Towners scoring 29 goals. 
