
I am looking forward to the back end of the season now with a chance to climb into the mid part of the table and look on towards next year.

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for this afternoon's Pitching In Isthmian League fixture against Hartley Wintney FC who are making only their second-ever visit to Northwood and their first since December 2017. That game ended in a 3-1 success for the Woods and a similar result is required today for the Woods to maintain their push towards mid-table. We hope that everyone connected with our visitors will enjoy their stay with us today and we wish you a safe journey home this evenina.

While that home game six years ago ended in victory, our trips to Hampshire have been less successful. In 2017, on the opening day of the season, we were beaten 2-0 by the newly-promoted Row and this season it was even more in favour of our opponents as they romped to a 4-0 victory.

Having been relegated from Step 3 last season, Hartley Wintney will have been looking to stabilise things and they have achieved that for sure, hardly ever dropping into the bottom half of the table. Memorable past meetings with Saturday's opponents Hartley Wintney

This was the first meeting of the clubs when Hartley Wintney had been promoted following two successive Combined Counties League titles. The home side could not have had a better start. They quickly won possession, knocked the ball forward for skipper Sam Argent to chest the ball down to Paul Hodges who neatly chipped Harry Voss for the opening goal after just 47 seconds of the new season.

Hartley looked the more likely to add to the scoreline and the goal duly came after 37 minutes when Woods failed to stop a cross from the right wing and Dean Stow fired the ball across goal, for Argent to deflect it past Voss. Five minutes later Northwood recorded their first real effort on goal as Harry Newman battled through the centre and hit a shot which was only just wide of the post.



Northwood rallied towards the end, looking for a consolation at least. Newman found Meshach Williams in the box and he set up Michael Osei for a shot which again flashed wide. Sinclair came off to deserved applause on 77 minutes, replaced by Archie James who almost got on the scoresheet himself three minutes later as Williams put in a great cross but the youngster just hesitated too long before trying to stretch and knock the ball in.

James did have an effort on goal on 82 minutes but Cawdron saved to deny him and both Martin Flannery and Under-18s striker Alex Grant were introduced in the final stages. The last effort on goal came in the final minute of normal time as James knocked in a cross and McCorkell,

We're getting into the final weeks of another campaign now so we take one of our regular looks of how the race to promotion, play-offs and the battle against relegation is developing.

SOUTH CENTRAL

It was billed as the big game on Tuesday night when the top two met at Alwyns Lane. It was a few weeks since Marlow imploded at home to Chertsey Town, having two players red-carded yet only going down by the odd goal. The return match, already postponed once on a recent Saturday, still attracted a massive crowd of 779 and it was against a single goal victory for the Curfews that gives them a pretty unassailable lead at the top of the table. They are now twelve points clear at the top with seven games to play (despite having a point deducted for an earlier registration indiscretion). Ten points from those seven matches would secure the title for sure.

Leatherhead's narrow 1-0 victory away at Ashford Town (Middlesex) on Tuesday night, saw them pull level on points with Marlow and are only behind them now on goal difference. Both seem set for home advantage in the play-offs though as they sit nine points ahead of the next group of three sides

Of those three sides, both Ravnes Park Vale, 2-1 Over Thatcham Town and Westfield, who won 1-0 at Chipstead. are really taking advantage of the poor recent form of Southall and it really is now a fight to the end as those three all look to grab the two other play-off positions. Westfield, who have won three on the spin and have a game in hand to their two rivals, could jump to fourth if they win that fixture. They play Raynes Park Vale today though and still have to face Chertsey Town and Marlow (and Northwood of course!). Southall play Chertsey Town today (and the Woods on Easter Monday) plus Leatherhead, Ravnes Park definitely appear to have the easiest run-in after they get today's game out of the way.

At the other end of the table. Binfield's home game against Sutton Common Rovers on Tuesday was postponed, leaving the club with ten games still to play. They have three in hand to

Chipstead (who have won just one of their last games) but are still ten points adrift of the Surrev side so will need to really continue with their battling recent form to have any chance. However, their remaining games do include matches against Chipstead. Ashford Town and Corinthian-Casuals (as well as Northwood on Tuesday night) so there are some possibilities.

Sadly, Corinthian-Casuals, who are facing a second successive relegation, haven't won a game since mid-November and, despite picking up a couple of points with improved performances recently, don't appear to have the form to create a great escape scenario.

PREMIER

Leaders Hornchurch had their eightgame winning sequence come to an end in midweek as they went down 1-0 at Hastings United who won with a late goal that kept their play-off hopes alive. The Urchins remain eleven points clear of Chatham Town at the top though with two games in hand. They need 11 points from their final nine matches to secure the Championship and promotion back to the National League South.

Their Kent rivals, only promoted from Step 4 last season, seem certainties for a home play-off place but the battle for the other three spaces is really bubbling up. As many as eight sides could make the end-of-season knockout as they fight it out for the other three places. This still includes Middlesex sides Enfield Town and Wingate & Finchley, Carshalton Athletic and the out-of-form Billericay Town (just one point from seven games) are just outside the play-off places but both have played two more games than their rivals and have only seven left so previously mentioned Hastings United, Dulwich Hamlet and Bognor Regis could all pounce with their games in hand.

At the other end of the table. Cheshunt have found some form at just the right time and they have gone eight

points clear of the bottom four (with Folkestone Invicta a further six points ahead of them). It means the bottom four now look doomed. Kingstonian are rock bottom. Concord Rangers are facing their second successive relegation while both Haringey Borough and Margate could be returning to Step 4. the Kent club for the first time since 1999.

NORTH

It was only a few weeks ago that Lowestoft Town looked certainties for the North Division title but three defeats in four games have allowed closest rivals, Felixstowe & Walton United climb a point ahead of them with six games to play. Throw in the fact that Bury Town (unbeaten since November) are now just seven points behind the new leaders with two cames in hand and it could be a very exciting finish to the campaign. Brentwood Town, who annihilated rock bottom Stowmarket Town 9-0 on Tuesday night are only three points behind them too while Bowers & Pitsea are also close by as they look to make a swift return to Step 3. Heybridge Swifts and Walthamstow are now seven points adrift of the top five so any play-off push will need to be very consistent. Walthamstow is the club that ex-Woods loan keeper Roraidh Browne is currently turning out for and they have won four out of five since he arrived, including two clean sheets so it's good to see that he has continued to perform.

As previously mentioned, the relegation places look certain. East Thurrock United folded during the early part of the season, they are reported to be reforming back at Step 6 or 7 while Stowmarket Town are set to book a quick return to Step 5 as they have still not won a game all season and remain thirteen points clear of safety with nine games to play.

SOUTH EAST

On Tuesday night, our FA Cup conquerors Crav Vallev PM climbed to the top of the table, ahead of our



FA Trophy conquerors Ramsgate with both sides having eight games still to play. The Millers romped to a 6-0 away win at bottom side Beckenham Town but there was another shock for the Rams as they crashed 1-0 at mid-table Horndean. The two rivals look set to continue to battle it out through to the end of the season and perhaps the crucial fixture will be on Saturday 13th April when Ramsgate play hosts to Cray Valley. One of them will have to join the lottery of the end of season play-offs where Sittingbourne look sure to be included. Other probables at this stage are Lancing and Chichester City while possibles are Three Bridges, Herne Bay and Hythe Town.

Both the bottom two, Beckenham Town and Erith & Belvedere are getting adrift and will need to hit form very soon if they are to avoid a return to Step 5.

OTHER NEWS

Sadly, North Greenford United's excellent run in the Isuzu FA Vase came to an end in the quarter-finals as they lost to Essex Senior League side Romford.

The former non-League giants now face United Counties League side Lincoln United over two legs in the semi-final (next Saturday and the week after) while another Essex Senior side, Great Wakering Rovers play favourites, the reformed Worcester City in the other semi-final.

From a Northwood throw, fifteen yards into the Baggies half, Dunbar-Bonnie's ball to Stacey was intercepted by Joshua Keeya, only on as a substitute four minutes earlier, and he rode a challenge from Gallagher, pushed it past Tingey and raced through unopposed before sliding it across for Caubo to notch an easy second. It was almost a hat-trick for the Badshot Lea striker as he was denied at closerange by McCorkell while the Woods then went close at the other end as Sam Jenkins got his head on a Dunbar-Bonnie chip into the box which looped over Cawdron but came down onto the crossbar and was cleared.

From here, the Woods lost their way. Former Woods Baback Deghani was denied by another McCorkell save but after 78 minutes Ceesay fired in a third. **GOAL ALERT**

4-0 Kareem Akinnibi (90+4')

The introduction of teenagers Archie James and Grant was unable to freshen up the Northwood side and the game ended in the fourth minute of stoppage-time when substitute Kareem Akinnibi headed home unchallenged from a well-flighted Keeva corner.

As is the way in a season of many postponed fixtures, fate has decreed that the return fixture at home to Badshot Lea is on Tuesday night and the visitors will be full of confidence following this success.

INTRODUCING OUR VISITORS HARTLEY





Hartley Wintney Football Club was founded in 1897, the club's nickname 'The Row' coming from Hartley Row, a former hamlet of Hartley Wintney.

In the 1940s and 50s, the club played at Causeway Farm in the Basingstoke League. The club moved to its Memorial Ground in Green Lane in 1953 and the team continued in the Basingstoke League, and later in the Aldershot League. In 1973, Glynn Howell was appointed Manager. In his six-year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup.

Hartley joined the Combined Counties League and later appointed Ian Bedford as First Team Manager. An influx of senior players during the 80s included several ex-pros: Mick Travers (1980-87, ex-Reading, Portsmouth & Aldershot); Richard Walden (1985-87; ex-Aldershot, Sheffield

Wed & Newport County): and Steve Finnieston (1985-88; ex-Chelsea, Cardiff & Sheffield Utd). Within Ian's three years in management, the team secured the league title in 82-83. having finished runners-up in 81-82. The Aldershot Senior Cup was won in 80-81, and the George Allen Cup in 81-82. The Row were also finalists in the League Cup (82-83) and Aldershot Senior Cup (81-82). During this period a new clubhouse was opened. David Willoughby, then Secretary and Treasurer, and Bill Mitchell, Club Chairman, devoted exceptional hours to this venture

In 2007-08 under manager Mike Scott, the club gained promotion to the Combined Counties Premier Division, but 08-09 ended in relegation. Under a new management team of Pete Grav and John Condon. the first team rallied, finishing 5th in CCL Div 1 in 09-10. Coach Louis King then took the

reigns as manager, guiding the team to 7th in CCL Div 1 in 2010-11.

Neville Roach took charge for 2011-12. assisted by Mick Wollen and Scott Tarr. and the club secured third in CCL Div 1, good enough for a return to the CCL Premier. Hartlev also had a fine FA Cup run to the Third Oualifving Round. But the euphoria of promotion was dampened when the coaching staff and nearly the entire squad left at the end of the season.

Ex-Millwall defender. Dave Tuttle. was given the summer to prepare a squad for 2012-13. However, a string of poor results led to a second change in management within four months. 24 year-old ex-Hartley striker, Ben Dillon, was given his first managerial role. Alongside Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, Ben set about rebuilding, with Hartley well adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit

around the club, and in what became known as the club's 'Great Escape', the Row's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds after a remarkable second half of the season.

Finishing 7th in CCL Premier in 2013-14, the footballing highlight was the run to the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the first time, losing to Daventry Town in front of a home crowd of over 1,000. The new club crest was commissioned during the season, designer Philippa Bell incorporating elements from the 13th century when the village of Hertleye Wynteneye drew its name from 'the clearing in the forest where the deer graze by Winta's island', hence the tree and stag motifs.

2014-15 saw the club finish 9th in the CCL Premier, after which Ben Dillon stepped down. Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed joint First Team Managers, with Luke Tuffs as First Team Coach.

2015-16 was very eventful. After a memorable FA Cup win at Merthyr Town, Hartley came back from 2 down only to concede an injury time goal at Conference South Eastbourne Borough. In the FA Vase, a longstanding club record was broken by reaching the 5th Round Proper. In front of a sell-out 1,300 at Green Lane, eventual finalists Hereford proved too strong, but the Row went on to claim the 2015-16 CCL Premier Division title, 10 points clear. Promotion was denied due to ground grading.

The 2016-17 season under Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick was extraordinary. Propelled by the goals of strike duo Sam Argent and Ross Cook, the Row topped the CCL Premier Division for the entire season, reached the semi-final of the Hampshire County Cup and Final of the Aldershot Senior Cup. The club secured the required ground grading to take their place in the Southern League at Step 4 for the first time.

2017-18 was as successful as the previous season. The club embarked on their first FA Trophy campaign, going out in the First Round Proper to eventual finalists, Bromley. In Southern League South (East Division), the Row sat within the top four for much of the season. A play-off place was secured, the Row winning their semi-final against AFC Dunstable. In front of a crowd of over 700 at Green Lane, a tense game was decided by a Nic Ciardini goal, on the end of Jack Ball's towering header, to gain promotion to the Southern Premier South at Step 3.

With Dan Turkington now alongside Anthony Millerick in the dugout, 2018-19 started well at Step 3, with a late run seeing Hartley finish 8th. To remain at the level required another round of ground improvements, stretching the club and its volunteers to the limit.

The 2019-20 campaign clicked into gear for the Row shortly before the season was abandoned due to the Covid pandemic. The return of familiar faces to the squad in the New Year promised an exciting run-in to the end. Instead, it became a battle off the pitch for the club's financial survival. This battle was to continue when 2020-21 was again cut short, though not before Hartley reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, going out at National League side Dagenham & Redbridge FC by a solitary goal.

There was deep sadness in 2021 when Club President, Bill Mitchell, passed away in April. He had been a huge influence on the club and a true gentleman who continued his family's tradition of being Hartley Wintney through and through.

2021-22 proved tough, with the club's resources severely depleted. The huge task of surviving at Step 3 was achieved by manager Anthony Millerick and his team with another good run-in to the end. After his hugely successful spell as manager, 'Millers' stepped down at the end of the season, becoming the club's Director of Football.

Ross Weatherstone and Ty Newton, were appointed joint managers for 2022-23 but the team struggled and the pair resigned in October. Ex-Arsenal pro, lan Selley was appointed, but after a reasonable start, results again failed to meet expectations.

Danny Ackland



Appointed in September 2023, the former Charlton Athletic youth player took up coaching over 20 years ago when unable to fully recover from a knee injury.

The 42-year-old worked in the US for four years, where he developed a coaching programme for young players. On his return to the UK, he joined Southampton as a youth coach, and after four years with the Saints took a similar role at AFC Bournemouth where he spent the next ten years. He also coached at Chelsea and Ipswich Town. After steering Eastleigh's reserve team of mostly UIB players to an 18-month unbeaten run and the league title, he joined Wessex League BAT Sports as manager in 2005, later joining Alresford Town as manager.


With the club in the relegation zone, the Row turned to two former players, Rowan Vine and Shane Hollamby. The pair steadied the ship but the lack of financial headroom finally hit home. Without a proven goal-scorer to turn the draws and narrow losses into wins, the Row were relegated.

After so much recent success, 2023/24 sees Hartley Wintney FC in the Isthmian League South Central and rebuilding under new manager Danny Ackland.

A versatile defender/midfielder. Georae re-sianed for the Row from Binfield in September 2023, having had a brief spell with Hartley in 22/23. After coming up through the youth academy at Reading, he spent two seasons at Alresford Town, captaining the side during his time there. He went on to play for Flagler Saints in Florida, then signed for Binfield on his return in 2022

RYAN CASE

Re-signed for the Row in January 2023, having previously been with

Hartley Wintney at step 3 in 2021/22, making his debut in the opening league game at Merthyr Town. Began his career at AFC Bournemouth and signed professional terms with the Cherries in 2012. His other clubs include Bath City. Eastbourne Borough. Gosport Borough, Chippenham Town and Dulwich Hamlet.
