





ALL TO THE SKYLINE ROOFING STADIUM.**



WELCOME TO THE BLUES & THE RAMS

Welcome back once again to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for the next two Pitching In Southern League home fixtures. We start today with the visit of high-flying Hertford Town and then, because of print deadlines over the Christmas/New Year period, we double up with our first game of 2026 against Beaconsfield Town in two weeks' time. We are delighted to host both clubs here at the Skyline and we hope they enjoy their stay with us.

Starting with Hertford and what a superb season they are having with their talented young side. Like Stotfold last weekend, they arrive in excellent form having lost just one of their last nine matches; ironically that was away at Stotfold back in mid-November. Their last two matches have seen them defeat league leaders Leighton Town 2-1 and then, last Saturday, they notched a sublime 5-0 victory away at play-off contenders Biggleswade Town.

The Blues currently sit in second place in the table, six points behind Leighton but with a game in hand and they can also boast that they are the division's top scorers in goals per game average.

However, this will be our return match this season against Hertford Town and our visit to Hertingfordbury Park back in September saw the Woods record their only away win of the season, recovering from going behind to a Lawrence Ajong goal to level through Dan Williams and then secure the three points when Osa Otote seized on a goalkeeping error with ten minutes to play.

In the corresponding fixture last season in March, Hertford completed the "double" over the Woods with a narrow 2-1 victory, coming from behind after Troy Perez-Duah had scored a penalty with goals from former Woods striker Ade Gbolahan and Ryan Bernal.

Our first game of 2026 will see Beaconsfield Town arrive at the Skyline for our first meeting of this season. The Rams have had a comfortable season so far this season, sitting in mid-table but they had been as high as second place after a good start to the season. Both former Northwood strikers, Ade Gbolahan and Manu Oke-Williams were in good form in that part of the campaign but it attracted others with the former joining Hitchin Town and more recently, Oke-William made the switch to join Isthmian Premier strugglers Welling United.

Another team with plenty of youth in their squad, Beaconsfield have lost five of their last seven matches at the time of writing with the two wins coming against strugglers Rayners Lane and AFC Dunstable. Our corresponding fixture last season was way back in

August 2024; our first game of the season, and ended in a comfortable 2-0 victory for the Rams with goals from Ben Tricker and Josh Marcon. The Woods did get revenge in the away game though, winning 2-1. Tricker again put Beaconsfield in front but goals from Godlove Oppong and then Ade Gbolahan won the three points.

Our match against Hertford Town today has no match sponsor but the match ball sponsor is Dennis Goulding and we thank him for his kind donation. Against Beaconsfield Town, Shamira Hamirani is our Match Sponsor and the Match Ball Sponsor is John Bridges so many thanks to him for stepping up in this way. As we managed to achieve last year, we'd love to fill in all the spaces for Match Ball sponsors throughout the season so if you can help out with one of the remaining games, please take a look at the grid elsewhere in today's programme (most remaining dates are available!) and let me know which you would like. The cost is £50.

LEAGUE NEWS

Last Saturday we picked up three excellent points from our home game against in-form Stotfold with a goal in each half earning the Woods a 2-0 victory. Stephane Bombelenga pounced to score on his home debut and then Dan Williams bagged his eleventh of the season to secure the win. Though all the teams below us lost on the day, both of the sides immediately above us also secured victories so it means that we currently remain just inside the bottom four so more consistent form in the coming weeks remains a priority.

Next Saturday, we have another crucial game away at Rayners Lane who have recently addressed their precarious position at the bottom of the table by bringing back financier into the fold so it will be interesting to see if that brings immediate improvement! It would be great to see lots of you making the short journey for our Middlesex "derby" match at Tithe Farm as your support could make a huge difference.

CUP NEWS

We had news of the forthcoming Middlesex Charity Cup a while back and it was surprising that we find ourselves already into the semi-finals as only five teams have entered the competition this season! North Greenford United take on Uxbridge in the only first round match on January 20th and the winners of that tie will join ourselves, Hanwell Town and Broadfields United (who have won the competition for the last two years) in the last four. News of that draw when we have it but the game is unlikely to be played until February or even March. The Woods have still never won the competition having been beaten in the final on five occasions between 1994 and 2023 so perhaps this is our year!

PLAYER UPDATES

The Woods management team are speaking to several players at the time of writing but no-one has been actually registered so nothing that I am able to report on as yet. It is quite likely that one or two new faces could be included in our squad for the next few games.

Skipper Manny Folarin made his 49th appearance for the club last Saturday so is set to play his 50th match when next on the pitch; hopefully this afternoon. Hafed Al-Droubi is close behind him on 47 at present so may also reach this milestone over the next couple of weeks. Incidentally, Carl Stewart is closing in on 150 matches for the Woods, the trigger that the club uses for a player to be declared as a Woods legend! He would be the first to do so since Andy Lomas in 2022/23 and Joakim Ehui back in 2016/17.

UNDER-18S

The Under-18s have continued with their brilliant start to the season with another two successful outings. The first was here at the Skyline where Walton & Hershaw were defeated 3-1 in the League Cup, giving the Woods a home tie against Hampton & Richmond Borough in the quarter-finals. The game is coming up quickly in the New Year, on Wednesday 7th January 2026 so please get along and support the lads as they look to go deep in the competition.

It was a League game at Badshot Lea on Monday this week and it was a hard-fought game at 1-1 approaching half-time but a three-goal blast inside just five minutes put the Woods 4-1 up at the break and they eventually enjoyed a 4-2 success and moved further clear at the top of the table.

However, they have only played six of the eighteen games scheduled this season so two-thirds of the

league season still to come. On Monday night, we face a tough away game against Camberley Town and by all accounts we are short on players due to the forthcoming Christmas holidays so it looks like being a real test.

CENTENARY SEASON

We've now had a series of meetings to discuss plans for how the club can celebrate 100 years of Northwood FC in 2026-27 with a whole range of ideas being considered and some of these are now pencilled in. We will of course we shall bring those to you as soon as we have firmed things up which is likely to be over the next few weeks. But if you would like to join us to help drive things along or help with any of the organising for these events then please speak to Liz Joyce who's heading things up for us. We will need some assistance with some of the events for sure so don't be shy in offering to help.

RIISING BALLERS NEWS

Our tenants picked up three valuable points from an away game against struggling Chalfont St Peter a couple of weeks ago but since then they have lost away at Staines & Lammas and Langley.

They have two further away games to play over the next couple of weeks, firstly at third-placed Penn & Tylers Green next Saturday and then they to Sandhurst Town to start the New Year. Their next home game is on Monday night, 5th January, which is the rescheduled fixture against in-form near-neighbours Hillingdon Borough and they follow that up on Saturday 10th against leaders Woodley United.

FROM THE DUGOUT

Hello, Woods fans!

It was a great win last Saturday against Stotfold. Our opponents were on a six-match unbeaten run coming to us and throughout the game, everyone played their part to secure the victory.

We got the group together for a meet-up the previous week on the Tuesday night at the club, just to get things out in the air. Feedback was given from management perspective and also the players chipped in with their ideas. It was good to get everything out in the open as we all feel we should be in a better league position. We did some analysis on previous matches and spoke openly about what we can do to improve as a collective. Everyone took everything on board and I think it showed in the performance on Saturday. Hopefully we can take this on in the other games coming up in the next couple of weeks over the festive period.

On Saturday, the work rate and desire from everyone was second to none and while Gabe was very good and picked up the Man of the Match vote afterwards, he has set that standard for himself in previous matches and, for someone so young, he never looks out of place. play the return game at Rayners Lane next Saturday, just after the Christmas festivities. They appear to be in the midst of changing their squad after the return of their "financier" last week so many are expecting them to start picking up points so again, we need to bring our A game to the match.

As this is a double-programme, Beaconsfield at home in two weeks' time is another big one I feel and we certainly want to enter 2026 with winning ways, leading to a strong finish to the season!

Northwood bounced back to form to notch their second home win in three games, most importantly keeping their first clean sheet in the League this season, against an in-form Stotfold side who were looking for a win to take them to the edges of the play-off places.

The Woods gave a starting debut to recent signing Stephane Bombelenga and were pleased to welcome back Hafed Al-Droubi in goal as well as young defender Gabe Cuthbert to bolster their central defence with Bryan Mankumbani moving across to play left-back.

The Eagles arrived on the back of a run which had seen them lose only to leaders Leighton Town in their last nine games with seven of them resulting in wins including games against promotion contenders Hertford Town and Biggleswade Town. They made just one change to their starting line-up with Seb Simpson preferred to Alex Coppin.

And the visitors certainly started on the front foot, looking full of confidence, knocking the ball around comfortably and forcing a couple of corners while also looking dangerous from some long-throws which had the Woods having to defend well.

The Woods first attack came after nine minutes when a Carl Stewart cross was only half-cleared by the Stotfold defence and the tenacity of Jon-Jo Bates in the box saw him fire a ball across the six-yard box but just out of the reach of and unmarked Dan Williams.

Stotfold hit back, forcing the first save of the game from Al-Droubi on seventeen minutes and a minute later Richesse Mvioki beat the Woods goalkeeper to a cross and his header had to be cleared away by a covering Manny Folarin.

29 MINUTES 1-0 STEPHANE BOMBELENGA

Northwood had hardly struck a blow in the final third until they were suddenly in front after twenty nine minutes when Ademede Baruwa sent in a long throw which was neatly headed on by Folarin and Bombelenga pounced in the middle to swivel and steer the ball past Liam Gooch in goal.

Soon after, another corner from the visitors was swung in

to the near post and Al-Droubi had to be alert to push the ball away with Freddie Ford and Stewart completing the clearance.



It certainly relieved any pressure for the final thirteen minutes of play and the Woods saw it out reasonably comfortably. Just one more substitution saw Jamie Kennedy replaced the hard-working Ford for his first action since October and the Eagles were restricted to just one effort on goal when a late free-kick saw a flicked header blocked by Al-Droubi with Folarin clearing away the loose ball to ensure that first clean sheet.

With the two sides immediately above them both winning, the Woods remain in the bottom four but with some much better form to build on when second-placed Hertford Town come to visit the Skyline next Saturday.





Hertford Town Football Club is a football club based in Hertford, Hertfordshire, England.

Established in 1901, we began under the name 'Port Vale Rovers' but it was quickly renamed to 'Hertford Football Club' to gain recognition as the town's main club. Following a merger with Hertford United, we were renamed 'Hertford Town'.

We joined the Eastern Division of the Hertfordshire Senior County League for the 1908-09 season, which saw us finish as runners-up. We also moved from Hartham and began to play our games at Hertingfordbury Park. We were placed in the Central Division the following season, but finished bottom and were moved into the Eastern Division in 1910. We also competed in the East Herts League which we won in 1912-13.

The following season, we retained our title and finished as runner up of the Eastern Division.

Around this time, a wooden stand was built, marking our first development of the ground.

During the Second World War, the league was abandoned. When it restarted in 1945, we were placed in the Central Division, finishing bottom of the table in the 1945-46 season.

Despite this poor performance, we were moved back into the Premier Division the following season, but we went on to finish bottom of the table again. The wooden stand was also destroyed by a fire in 1946, topping off a poor season for us. The ground's owner passed away the following year which forced us to drop out of football for a season due to the unavailability of the ground. We returned to the Spartan League in 1948, where we were placed into Division One East. After winning the division in 1949-50, we were promoted back to the Premier Division in 1950. The late 1950s saw

the next major development in our ground. Pitch drainage was improved, a wooden clubhouse was built and the ground was fully enclosed with a concrete wall.

In 1959, a 300 seater stand with dressing rooms and a boardroom was completed, along with extra toilet facilities for the spectators in the ground. A four-step concrete terrace was built opposite this stand.

A few years later, a six-step concrete terrace was completed at the south end of the ground behind the goal. This became known as 'The Stable End'.

Around these times, during the 1960-61 and the 1961-62 seasons, we joined the Delphian League and won back-to-back league titles. The 1962-63 season was abandoned due to bad weather but we won both the League Cup and the Eastern Section of the emergency competition. We also won the East Anglian Cup by

beating Boston United 1-0 in the final, a match played at home in front of a crowd of 3,000. The Delphian League was then abandoned at the end of the season.

We, among many other teams from the Delphian League, joined the new Division Two of the Athenian League. We finished fourth in 1963-64 and earned promotion to Division One. We also went on to win the league's Memorial Shield in 1967-68. In 1974, a new clubhouse was built at a cost of over £25,000, which replaced the old wooden one. During this time, we switched leagues twice but settled in Division Two of the Isthmian League. The division was renamed Division One in 1977, and we were faced with relegation to Division Two North after finishing bottom in 1984-85. We were placed into Division three after some reorganisation from the league but earned promotion to Division Two after finishing runners-up in 1998-99. However, we were relegated the following season. On January 26th 1992, the clubhouse was destroyed by a fire and was replaced by a much

smaller building.

After further reorganisation from the league, we were placed in Division One North in 2002 but were quickly relegated to Division Two.

After the division was disbanded in 2006, we joined the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midlands League. We finished runners-up in 2016-17 and were promoted to Division One North of the Isthmian League.

At the end of the 2020-21 season which was heavily affected by Covid 19, we were transferred to Division One Central of the Southern League.

In October 2021, we made more pitch developments by installing a cork-filled 3G pitch.

Having this all-weather pitch has enabled us to share the ground with other clubs. In the 2022-23 season, St. Panteleimon FC used the Stadium for their home matches and in the 2023-24 season, Hatfield Town used the stadium for their home matches. In 2023, Smile IT Solutions sponsored

the ground and renamed it 'The Smile IT Stadium'. Currently, Hertford have united with Hertford Town Youth, Hertford Town Girls, Hertford Town Women's, Hertford Town's Inclusive Team and Hertford Town's Walking Football Team who all base themselves at the club, bringing the community together.

2024/25 started slow for Hertford, not picking up their first win until October.

They picked things up during the middle and latter stages of the season and ended with a respectable mid-table finish.

A lot of changes occurred to playing and coaching staff in the pre-season of the 2025-2026 season, and they've started the season very well – two convincing FA Cup wins and an opening day victory in the league against Thame United.

There's a real sense of belief within the young squad and a push for promotion could very well be on the cards.

Though formed as recently as the summer of 2017 the roots of Beaconsfield Town FC stem from Beaconsfield SYCOB which was founded in 1994 following a merger between Beaconsfield United and Slough Youth Centre Old Boys (hence the “SYCOB” in the Clubs name).

United dated back to 1921 and were themselves a coming together of two local teams whilst Slough Youth Centre formed their first football team in 1938. With Slough Youth Centre Old Boys unable to progress due to a lack of ground provisions and United themselves struggling on and off the field at the time the decision was taken to amalgamate the two clubs and so Beaconsfield SYCOB was born.

Initially playing in the London Spartan Premier Division, and with Fred Deanus as Chairman, Beaconsfield SYCOB chalked up a series of Top Five finishes before finally winning the league in 2000 / 01 under the guidance of Simon Delahunty. However they were refused promotion to the Isthmian League due to some harsh technicalities over the terms of their lease. A further three seasons were spent in the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division before Beaconsfield SYCOB again won the league in 2003 / 04 and this time gained promotion to the Southern Football League (Division One East).

The Rams made solid progress in their early years at Step 4 and over three seasons played in three different leagues – Division 1 East,

Division 1 West and finally Division 1 South & West from where they were relegated in 2006 / 07. However the appointment of ex-player Jamie Jarvis, ably assisted by Peter Scott, saw The Rams not only win the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division at the first attempt but also win the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the Premier Division League Cup, a fantastic treble of silverware.

Promoted to Division 1 South & West, the club finished a highly creditable fourth place and made the Play Offs before losing out to AFC Totton. Moving to the Southern League Midland Division for 2009 / 10, Beaconsfield SYCOB then went through a succession of managers, players, highs and lows until finishing in bottom place in 2010 / 11. Only a



reprieve and a league restructure saved The Rams from the drop but since then they have gone on to over achieve for a club of its size. Under the guidance of Byron Walton they finished fifth in the 2011-12 season and lost out in the Play Off Final to Bedworth United. The following season and with James Pritchard at the helm they again finished fifth but lost out to Rugby Town in a Play Off Semi-Final though the season did end with some silverware following a fine win over Chesham United in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup.

2013-14 saw Gary Meakin take over as manager just five days before the start of the season and with only five players on the clubs books – to finish 8th and reach the Quarter Finals of the League Cup was a fine achievement as was a runner up spot in the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Cup, Chesham United gaining revenge for defeat twelve months earlier.

The 2014-15 season saw a partnership with the FAB Academy who

provided the bulk of the teams players under the stewardship of Andy Hurley and Nas Bashir. That partnership continued into 2015-16 season with Geoff Warner as manager as The Rams finished in a respectable ninth place whilst the 2016-17 season saw them under joint managers Andy Hurley and Leigh Wooldridge and ended with a 16th place league finish though a run to the Fourth Qualifying Round of the F.A. Cup was a “Best Ever” for SYCOB.

The 2017-18 season saw the return of Gary Meakin as the first manager of the newly named Beaconsfield Town, with Chris Coyle as Chairman. The Rams had virtually a whole new team and, helped by an amazing away record, they kept in touch with the League pacesetters to finally gain top spot on the last day of the season and claim the Evo-Stik League South, East title. Competing at Level 3 for the first time in their history in the newly formed Evo-Stik League South Premier South division, The Rams achieved a

highly credible 12th place finish as well as reaching the First Round of the F.A. Trophy for the first time in their history, losing out to eventual finalists Leyton Orient.

The truncated 2019/20 season saw the club expanding with the establishing of an Academy as well as an Under 18 team and plans in place to add further age group sides as The Rams look to build for the future both on and off the pitch.

In recent seasons, the senior squad has consolidated its position in the Southern League Premier Division South, competing strongly against well-established sides. The team has integrated several academy graduates, demonstrating the success of the club’s player development pathway. With improved coaching, performance analysis tools, and a strong recruitment strategy, the Rams have consistently aimed for top-half finishes and remain ambitious about pushing for play-off positions.

Holders Northwood moved into the quarter-finals of the Spartan League Cup with a 3-1 midweek win over Beaconsfield.


Woods went 1-0 down early in the game, but battled back after half-time to keep the Chestnut Avenue crowd happy.

Blackman assured victory minutes later, though, when he waltzed through the Beaconsfield defence to slot home his second goal.





Laurence Yaku replaced Newing at the start of the second half, and scored with an excellent header in the closing stages, though all the damage had been done in the first 45 minutes.


Leighton had some chances to get on the scoresheet, but two excellent saves from Riordan left them goalless.


After 85 minutes Marlow pulled one back through top scorer Couch after he was put through on goal by Marcus Mealing. But Woods hung on for the points.


