



WELCOME TO THE GREEN

A warm welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for another Pitching In Southern League fixture, this time against Leverstock Green who arrive in fine form. We hope everyone connected with the Reds enjoys their afternoon here at the club and we wish you a safe journey home later this evening.

Like ourselves, Leverstock Green, under the management of former Woods defender Fergus Moore, had a tremendous finish to last season, their first at Step 4, winning five of their last six matches to avoid relegation by just one point. The Greens have not rested on their laurels and, prior to their game at Hertford Town on Tuesday night, had lost just two of ten Leaque matches.

Six of their games have ended all-square though, including their last five matches and amongst those have been 1-1 draws away at top sides Flackwell Heath and Welwyn Garden City. They also held Leighton Town to a 2-2 draw in a home match. Their victories to date were back-to-back at the end of August, 3-2 away at Stotfold and then 2-1 against Thame United. Both losses have been against sides in and around the play-off places, 1-2 at home to Barton Rovers and 5-3 at Biggleswade Town having led 2-0 and 3-2 during the first-half

Cup results have not been so successful, losing 0-1 at home against Step 5 side Ilford in the FA Cup on the opening day of the season and 2-0 at Isthmian North club Lowestoft Town in the FA Trophy.

Last season was the first time that our two clubs have met in competitive football and it was our opponents that enjoyed the better of the two encounters. The game here at the Skyline was just over a year ago and is covered in more detail elsewhere in today's programme. Both sides were looking for their first win of the season and it ended 2-2. Giuseppe Delgaudio netted both goals for the Green while Gabriel Ipanga-Mbambo scored twice for the Woods. The return came on a Tuesday night at the beginning of April and was one of those games that Leverstock Green won to avoid relegation, taking all three points with a 1-0 success thanks to a Callum Neal header on 54 minutes.

We are ever-grateful to our sponsors and this afternoon's fixture has been kindly sponsored by Gerry Pimm as part of his 1926 Membership package and we hope both he and his guests enjoy the Boardroom hospitality on offer. LEAGUE NEWS

Last Saturday proved another tough day at the office for the Woods as unbeaten Leighton Town romped to a 5-0 victory here at the Skyline. Former Woods striker Godlove Oppong netted twice and ex-Northwood goalkeeper Dan Hosier comfortably kept a clean-sheet as our opponents proved far too strong. They didn't need help from the match officials but got it for the third of the five goals as they somehow failed to spot Hafed Al-Droubi being pushed over the line when catching a cross above his head. Our run of form at home has now stretched to six successive league defeats to start the season with and needs to be halted now. The Leighton game was our worst league result since a 1-7 home defeat against Uxbridge back in September 2021. After today, we then have to defend our current unbeaten away record with a tough game at Hitchin Town next Saturday, followed by a midweek fixture at Milton Keynes Irish. Any support at these games would be very welcome.

CUP NEWS

Well, Tuesday night's Senior Cup fixture at Hanworth Villa was a bit different. Just the night before, an email dropped into my in-box showing that our opponents had written to the County advising them that they wished to withdraw from the competition due to wanting to rest players. They were not alone in having withdrawal symptoms as Bedfont Sports had done the same a short time before this and their home game against Hanwell Town was also awarded to their opponents.

So, the Woods are now through to the quarter-finals of the Middlesex Senior Cup and we await the draw being made. The next round is scheduled for week-commencing 3rd November so just after our next home game against Ware.

There was a time that the Senior Cup was considered to be a prestigious competition for clubs in the County, religiously fought for by the might of Middlesex. Nowadays, with Brentford, Barnet and QPR entering but playing younger age-group teams, many clubs tend to rest players for the early rounds and our topranked non-League side, Wealdstone, didn't even enter which seems a bit of a shame

The Woods have won the Senior Cup twice, the last being ten years ago when we defeated Enfield Town 2-0 in the 2015-26 final.

DUGOUT WITH ASSISTANT MANAGER, DENNIS QUIGLEY

Good afternoon, Woods fans!

Welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium and a special welcome to the management from our opponents this week,Leverstock Green FC, led by Fergus Moore.

Last Saturday was a result we certainly don't want to be on the receiving end of again this season. I have to give credit to Leighton Town as they're a very well organised and strong outfit and you can see why they're at the top end of the table.

For us, I felt the team selected and the way we set up tactically was definitely the right one but in a first-half where both teams were having chances, we find ourselves having a possible equaliser blocked on the line and then Leighton going up the other end and scoring in a matter of minutes.

These are exactly the fine margins we're working on to change our recent run of bad form. Even at 0-2 down, I believed we were still in the game but unfortunately, I got to witness first hand one of the worst refereeing decisions at any level of football let alone ours but as Mourinho once said, I prefer not to speak because if I speak, I'm in trouble!

Of course, then at 0-3, it's a mountain to climb and all guns blazing which left us a bit more exposed at the back for the counter-attack and a more emphatic scoreline going against us, but I'd rather lose going for it than sit back and see out a defeat.

Being at home for so many games in recent weeks we certainly saw it going differently in terms of results. Our plan to shake this form and get points on the board is simple and without giving too much away the message is clear. Get back to basics, enjoy defending and get our attackers firing.

At this point of the season there's definitely a lot still to play for. Three points gets us moving up a few places, six points gets us sitting around mid-table. In my opinion, the league table won't really take shape until Christmas time and by then we're going to make sure it's not a conversation of how are we going to move up the table but it will be more how did you do that.

Brandon Talla has joined us and we're excited at the potential shown in his short time with us so far. There are also a few possible recruits that we've spoken to in recent weeks and it's looking very positive from the conversations we've had. We're certainly very optimistic there may be a few welcome additions in the next week.



Our visitors today have started the season very well. Without giving away too many details, like every game, we have a plan to execute this afternoon. It's time to turn our home ground back into a fortress and make it difficult for teams to visit.

As always, I wish Leverstock Green a safe journey to and from the game and my best wishes for the season ahead.

WOODS FALL TO A HEAVY HOME DEFEAT

Unbeaten Leighton Town proved too strong for the Woods on a pleasantly sunny Saturday afternoon at the Skyline Roofing Stadium, romping to a victory which was Northwood's worst loss in four years.

Jon-Jo Bates, Harry McKenna, Freddie Ford and Hicham Bouchareb were all brought into the starting line-up with Henry Atkinson, Dylan Kearney and Jack Smith all reverting to the bench while Reece Price-Placid was missing after picking up a knock the previous week. New signing Brandon Talla, a young defender recruited from Wealdstone Academy, was given a place in the bench alongside Jamie Kennedy with Devonte Totesaut. Osa Otote and Nasir Sharifi all rules out.

The visitors arrived with former Woods goalkeeper Dan Hosier back from injury to start alongside two other ex-Woods in Kyal Williams and Godlove Oppong while top scorer Sydney Ibie, who left Northwood for Dagenham & Redbridge just two years ago, was on the bench resting a knock suffered a week earlier.

Leighton looked strong from the start and had their first opportunity on 14 minutes when Oppong got his head to a cross from the right but Hafed Al-Droubi did well to react quickly and palm it over the bar.

20 MINUTES: 0-1 GODLOVE OPPONG

But he could do nothing to deny the former Woods striker six minutes later when a cross from Lewis Thorpe was set up by Williams to allow Oppong to fire cleanly into the far corner

Northwood tried to hit back almost immediately when Dan Williams tried his luck from distance with a powerful strike but Hosier was well positioned to claim it above his head. The Woods continued to press with Williams linking up with Bouchareb to force a corner but that came to nothing.

The visitors were still looking dangerous but it was the Woods who looked likely to level after 41 minutes when a cross from Mack Miskin was cleared to Bates who



iinked into the box and looked all set to score but an excellent defensive block denied him

45 MINUTES: 0-2 LEO FARRUCH

The home side were made to pay just before the break as Leighton notched an important second goal. Oppong turned provider this time with a cross to the far post where Leo Farruch guided a shot back across goal and inside the far post.

HT: NORTHWOOD 0-2 LEIGHTON TOWN

52 MINUTES: 0-3 HAFED AL-DROUBI (OG)

Already with a difficult second-half ahead of them, Al-Droubi had to tip over an inswinging corner early on before being a victim of a shocking decision from the match officials which gifted Leighton a third goal on 52 minutes. A deep cross from the left from Tolu Kunming was collected up high by Al-Droubi but BJ Christie clearly pushed him over the line with two arms only for a "goal" to be awarded.

65 MINUTES: 0-4 GODLOVE OPPONG

Changes were made to both personnel and formation with Smith and Kearney replacing Ford and Bouchareb but it only got worse almost immediately when Oppong found acres of space to receive a ball from Christie and slot home his second.



Jamie Kennedy replaced an injured Carl Stewart on sixty seven minutes and the Woods did start to create a little more in the closing stages starting with Kearney setting up Williams for a shot but that flew wide of the target.

But Leighton continued to threaten too. A Farruch free-kick went just over the bar on 79 minutes and five minutes later a quick break saw Rio DaSilva set up Charlie Pattison for a chance but Al-Droubi made a great save to deny him.

86 MINUTES: 0-5 BJ CHRISTIE

There was still time for the visitors to grab a fifth goal on 86 minutes as the errant Christie, a recent recruit from Berkhamsted, netted from close-range for his first Leighton goal.

Talla was introduced for the five minutes of stoppage-time and it was Northwood who had the last effort on goal when Ademide Baruwa finally tested Hosier but he was more that equal to it and the final whistle cued celebrations amongst the large travelling contingent of Leighton fans.

After extending their home league record to six defeats in six games, the Woods will need to up their game when Leverstock Green come to visit at the Skyline next Saturday.

The Woods enjoyed a dominant performance at Spartan South Midlands side Leverstock Green which ended in a comprehensive 10-0 victory.

Pat Adamson was prominent early on and had seen one effort cleared off the line before being set up to slot in the opening goal after 17 minutes. A penalty just two minutes later enabled a trialist to double that lead and then the same player added a third after just 25 minutes.

Leverstock Green Football Club was formed around 1895. The first match reports appeared on January 4th 1896 in the Advertiser and gave an account of a match against Hemel Hempstead Rovers.

The first competitive fixtures were reported during season 1908/1909 when the Club competed in Division Three of the West Herts League. Other clubs competing in the league at that time were: Abbots Langley, Bovingdon, Boxmoor, Bushey Heath, Hagden Lane, Kings Langley and Potten End.

The Club ground in Pancake Lane originally formed part of the Gorhambury Estate, Lord Verulam making the ground available for the youth of the area and his estate workers to enjoy a game of ball. Clearly Lord Verulam was an early enthusiast, providing timber-built changing rooms, which have been progressively replaced since the 1960's by the existing brick built clubhouse and changing rooms.

On the death of the Lord, certain parcels of land, including that on which the Football Club stood, fell to the Crown in lieu of death duties and is administered on its behalf by the Commission for New Towns, who have remained the Club's landlords since that time, despite two unsuccessful attempts by the Club to buy the freehold.

The club remained members of the West Herts League until 1954 when it broadened its horizons and successfully applied to join the Herts County League.

By the mid 1970's the Club started to move forward with a new clubhouse, post & rail and the installation of training lights.

The playing side of the club also improved and in 1979 the club won Division One of the Herts County League and were promoted to the Premier Division the highest standard the Club had achieved in 80 years.

In 1991 the Club were accepted into the South Midlands League and had two highly successful seasons in the Premier Division before being forced to drop into the Senior Division, as floodlights were then not available. In 1996 the club finished in runners-up position and the following season were the divisional champions but could not be promoted because floodlights had still not received approval from the Council.

Premier Division status was eventually regained in 2003, and the club spent 21 straight seasons in the division before promotion to Step Four in 2024. The club's highest finish in the Premier Division has been 4th, in seasons 2010/11 and 2023/24, with top six finishes also being recorded in 2005/06, 2006/07 and 2008/09.

Season 2010/11 also saw the club's best ever run in the FA Vase, with wins over Welwyn Garden City, Enfield, Hullbridge Sports, Tunbridge Wells and Bemerton Heath Harlequins before defeat in the Fifth Round against Rye United. The club has twice reached the Third Round of the FA Vase, in seasons 2006/07 and 2018/19.

Leverstock Green entered the FA Cup for the first time in 2004, and the club's best performance has been reaching the Second Round Qualifying, which was achieved in 2014/15, where we were beaten by Staines Town, and in 2018/19 where we were beaten by Dorking Wanderers

County honours were won in 2006/07 and 2010/11 as the Herts Charity Shield was lifted, and the club were beaten finalists in the Herts Charity Cup in 2011/12. After finishing runners-up four times over the previous 12 years, The West Herts FA St Many's Cup was finally lifted for the first time in 2017/18 with victory over Berkhamsted in the final at Vauxhall Road.

Between 2005 and 2015 the club ran a successful Ladies' Team, which rose from the Beds and Herts League into the Eastern Region Women`s League, reaching the Premier Division in 2013.

The under-18 side competes in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League. The team finished runners-up in their division in seasons 2010/11 and 2014/15, and in 2015/16 they reached the final of both the Brian Hitchings Cup and the Colwyn Cup, losing in both finals to Luton Town Cedars.

Many players have made the step up from under-18 level to first team level, and those who have gone on to play much higher up the non-league pyramid include Charlie Gorman (Eastbourne Borough), Luke Warner-Eley (Royston Town, St Albans City) and Jonathan Lacey (Hemel Hempstead Town) who also represented the England nonleague side in the Falklands while a Leverstock Green player.

The Pancake Lane ground has seen many improvements due to ever more stringent ground grading requirements. In 2007 the Peter Metcalfe changing rooms were built at a cost of £90,000. 2008 saw the refurbishment of the clubhouse to include new toilets and a new hospitality suite. In 2009 the

concrete walkway was completed to cover three sides of the ground and a seated stand accommodating 113 spectators was installed.

Season 2018/19 was one of turmoil and sadness, as long-serving fixture secretary Graham Smart passed away suddenly only weeks after taking on the role of interim chairman. A season which promised so much at the start ended with the club only securing Premier Division safety on the final day.

Emma Smart took over as chairman for season 2019/20, and with a new management team and a new spirit of optimism the club was on course for a safe mid-table finish before the season was brought to a premature end by Covid-19.

The management team of Matt Harding and Mick Vipond continued into the 2020/21 season, which again came to a premature end.

For season 2021/22, a new management team of Fergus Moore, Scott McGleish and Paul Marks was appointed. Fergus and Scott continued through season 2022/23 and won their first silverware for the club with a 1-0 win over Tring Athletic in the final of the West Herts St Mary's Cup.

Fergus and Scott were joined by former Under-18 manager Ross Bargent for season 2023/24, and the club also started a Development Team, playing in the Herts Senior County League Premier Division.

2023/24 proved to be an incredibly successful season for the club, as a fourth-place finish secured a place in the end-of-season playoffs, and victories over Harpenden Town and FC Romania saw the club promoted to Step Four for the first time in their history.

In addition the SSML Challenge Trophy was won for the first time to complete a unique double.

The club's first season in the Southern League Division One Central proved to be a tough challenge and a steep learning curve. After 30 games Leverstock had just two wins and 18 points, but a miraculous run of 7 wins from the last 10 games culminated in a last-day escape from relegation with a 3-1 win at AFC Dunstable. Along with the necessary ground grading



THE MANAGER FERGUS MOORE

Has had a distinguished career of over 30 years in non-league football. most notably as a player for Wealdstone for many years, and as player-manager at Edgware Town, still turning out when approaching the age of 50. Fergus joined the club as manager in the summer of 2021 and has turned the club's fortunes around.

The second was Bill Dawes in 2014, and the third was long-serving club secretary Brian Barter in 2019. Brian stood down from his role as secretary in 2020, having twice been honoured with awards from the Spartan South Midlands League.


The fourth was Tony Smart, who now holds the role of Treasurer.

The Woods were away at National League South Eastbourne Borough U18s last night in the third qualifying round of the FA Youth Cup and obviously the result isn't known at the time of writing these notes so we can only hope that the side managed to get a result in what was clearly going to be a tough fixture.

In the meantime, Ken Green spoke to the side's manager Jamie Barry, ahead of the 200-mile round-trip prior to the game and here's the interview:

"We'll be travelling down on the coach in the afternoon ahead of the evening kick-off, and the lads are really looking forward to it.'

"It's been some journey to get here. We started off against Tring Athletic in the preliminary round, a side that actually knocked us out a couple of seasons ago, so we knew it would be a tough one. But the boys were excellent that night. We looked comfortable throughout and came away with a solid 4-0 win, which was a great start and a real credit to the players."

"Next up was Hayes & Yeading United in the first qualifying round. I didn't know much about them other than they've got a strong academy setup, and they'd actually taken one of our lads. Stanley Geraghty, for that game, So, we knew they had talent on and off the pitch. It was a tough battle, a tight 1-0 for most of it, but we stayed patient and got a second late on through Rowan Daly to seal a 2-0 win. A proper gritty performance and one to be proud of."

"That set up a second round qualifying tie away at Kings Langley, who we also met last year and that one went to penalties too! This time, they went 1-0 up, which was actually the first goal we had conceded from open play in five games this season. The lads reacted brilliantly. though: we got back into it after a bit of controversy, a clear handball on the line that only resulted in a yellow card. Up stepped Freddie Ford, who saw his penalty saved but reacted quickest to slot in the rebound for 1-1.

"It stayed level through to full-time and once again it went to a shoot-out. To be honest, it wasn't our best display overall, a bit scrappy, not quite at our best but when you don't play well and still find a way to win, it says a lot about the group. Massive credit to Matthew Burrows in goal who pulled off some big saves and deservedly took the man of the match award.

"That win booked our place in the third round qualifying away at Eastbourne Borough. It's going to be a great challenge against a well-run National League South academy side who've started their season strongly. That said, they haven't finished too high up the table in recent years, so I genuinely think we've got every chance to go there, put in a performance, and make the first round proper - which has been my goal from day one

"On a personal note, this club means absolutely everything to me. Everyone knows that my dad is the chairman, and I'll be honest, when I took the job there were a few question marks and a bit of pressure on me to prove myself. But I think the results over the last two seasons have spoken for themselves.

"The work ethic on and off the pitch is brilliant, and there's a real togetherness throughout the club. My son spends a lot of time growing up around the club as well as I did in my younger years, my brother is my assistant manager, and even for the lads, it feels like family. Which is how I've always felt around the club and this fills me with pride on a weekly basis.


