WELCOME TO THE LIONS & THE OD'S

Welcome back once again to the Skyline Roofing Stadium for another double-issue matchday programme which covers a further two home games over a five-day period. That starts tonight with a first-ever visit from London Lions FC and is followed at the weekend when AFC Dunstable pay us a visit for the first "return" fixture of the season having staged the opening day match which ended in a 2-2 draw. We hope that everyone connected with both of our visiting teams enjoys their stay with us and we wish you all a safe journey back afterwards.

London Lions were promoted from the Spartan South Midlands League at the end of last season by way of the play-offs having finished fourth in the table despite losing ten matches during the campaign of 34 games. They won the semi-final against Cockfosters on penalties and then repeated that feat in a final against fifth-placed Wormley Rovers. They had enjoyed Step 6 success when previously winning the Combined Counties League first division in 2022 and were Herts Counties League Champions (Step 7) back in 2017 so it's been a good decade for the club.

Our visitors made a slowish start to their first experience of Step 4 football with defeats in the opening rounds of both FA competitions - 3-1 at Hertford Town in the FA Cup and 0-3 at home to Isthmian North side Tilbury in the FA Trophy; but they did recover from a 4-0 loss at Flackwell Heath by thrashing Rayners Lane 5-1 at Rowley Lane to notch their first points. Goals were hard to come by after that until then gaining revenge over Hertford Town in a home league match by beating them at the end of September by a 2-0 scoreline. They have continued to struggle for points away from home having picked up just one point from seven matches - a creditable 2-2 draw at Biggleswade just last week. But on their own ground they have defeated Aylesbury United 4-1 and AFC Dunstable 2-1 which has given them twelve home points from eight matches; a pretty good return. On Saturday they crashed 0-4 at home to an improving Marlow side.

We meet for the first-ever time this evening and we look forward to the return game in early March on what by all accounts is an excellent and well looked after grass surface.

It's three months since we started the league season with an away game at AFC Dunstable, on another excellent grass pitch! The home side had moved into a 2-0 lead during the first-half with goals from Thomas Blennerhassett and Tali Jallow but the Woods forced their way back into the match after the break with Devonte Totesaut scoring and then equalised with

almost the last kick of the game when the recently departed Mack Miskin scored direct from a freekick. Our opponents won at Welwyn Garden City immediately after that but also lost to Tilbury in the FA Cup. They hit further good form in September in the FA Trophy with an excellent 1-0 victory at Maldon & Tiptree being followed by a 3-1 success at Enfield. That earned them a home tie against Isthmian Premier side Folkestone Invicta, where they exited with a 1-3 defeat. League form has eluded them since that period though with just one win – a 2-0 success at home to Aylesbury United - in their last thirteen matches (at the time of writing). Their 3-1 defeat at Hertford Town last Saturday was a fourth successive reverse but they would have been looking to bounce back on Tuesday night at home to Biggleswade Town.

The corresponding fixture last season was played just after Christmas 2024 and saw the Woods record a narrow 1-0 victory thanks to an early Troy Perez-Duah penalty.

We have no match sponsor for the two matches this week but we do have Match Ball donors with Ken Green and Sandy Young kindly sponsoring the ball for the historic London Lions visit while Gerry Pimm has stepped up to be sponsor for our match against AFC Dunstable. We thank all our match ball sponsors this season as it is much appreciated and helps a great deal as a fund-raiser. As last year, we'd love to fill in all the spaces for Match Ball sponsors throughout the year so if you can help, please take a look at the grid elsewhere in today's programme as all our remaining games are available and let me know which game you would like. The cost is £50.

LEAGUE NEWS

Two more League games and two more draws since our last programme notes means that we have now created a club record of FIVE successive league draws for the first-ever time. There had been four previous occurrences of having drawn four in a row, the last in 2015 and the first being way back in 1973.

Against Ware, we played some excellent football in the first-half and led early when Osa Otote fired home. Sadly, we weren't able to add to that score despite dominating much of the first-half and then we sat back a little too much after the break which allowed Ware to get back level and we had to settle for a point once again.

On Saturday, we went to Welwyn Garden City and maintained our unbeaten away record this season with yet another draw, this time 2-2. The home side led after just two minutes but young defender Gabe Cuthbert headed an equaliser just two minutes later with his first goal for the club and Dan Williams hit an excellent

second to lead at the break. The second-half was interrupted by two red cards almost immediately, one almost immediately after the other. Sadly, our captain Manny Folarin was the first of those, our first red card of the season and shown for an off-field indiscretion! From the restart, Welwyn's just introduced substitute followed him to the changing-rooms for a heavy challenge. We missed chances to wrap up the game on several occasions and then succumbed to an 84th minute goal which squared things up once more.

CUP NEWS

We also drew our Middlesex Senior Cup quarter-final last week against Isthmian side Southall. It wasn't the greatest of games for sure and it ended in a 0-0 draw after ninety minutes, our first goalless match since a league game at Metropolitan Police back in April 2024 and the first here at the Skyline since a 0-0 against

Binfield back in March 2023! Being a cup game, this of course went to the penalty shoot-out and it was our visitors who came out on top, winning 4-3 after their 'keeper made saves from two of our kicks.

We had news of the forthcoming Middlesex Charity Cup recently and it's surprising that we find ourselves already into the semi-finals as only five teams have entered the competition this season!

North Greenford United take on Uxbridge in the only first round match and the winners of that tie will join ourselves, Hanwell Town and Broadfields United (who have won the competition for the last two years) in the last four.

News of that draw when we have it but the game is unlikely to be played until the New Year. The Woods have still never won the competition having been beaten in the final on five occasions between 1994 and 2023 so perhaps this is our year!

Two players will be suspended for our game against AFC Dunstable on Saturday with Manny Folarin and Omar Rowe both ruled out after cards last weekend.

A further Under-18 player made his debut in our County Cup game against Southall last week when Rowan Daly came off the bench. He was ruled out with injury for Saturday's match at Welwyn but is likely to be involved when he back to fitness. It's great to see players from the in-form youngsters being promoted to show their talent in the first-team with Freddie Ford and Henry Atkinson also involved regularly so far.

More success for the Under-18s side recently as they beat leaders Maidenhead United 4-2 in the Isthmian Youth League and then followed up that with a 3-0 win over Farnham Town in the League Cup. FROM THE DUGOUT WITH

WITH ASSISTANT MANAGER DENNIS QUIGLEY

Hello, Woods fans!

Welcome back to the Skyline Roofing Stadium and a special welcome to the management from our two sets of opponents this week,firstly London Lions FC, led by Andrew Landesberg and then AFC Dunstable FC, with James Townsend heading up their group.

Looking back over the last two weeks, while it's been good to have continued our unbeaten run, it's also frustrating that we've been unable to convert any of this into three-pointers.

We've created plenty of chances and not converted them which has ultimately cost us either three points from games or a place in the next round in respect of the Cup-tie.

While I was away for the game against Ware, the feedback I received and by also watching the game back on the Veo, it seemed to me that we should have come away with three points from this game.

The Southall game, I do believe we could and should have won inside the ninety minutes but ended up losing on penalties which is always tough to take. But, the hardest of all was at Welwyn Garden City at the weekend where I felt we did enough to have to record a much-needed win. The response to going I-O down so early was phenomenal and we fully deserved our 2-1 lead at the break. Even after the three minutes of madness, with two red cards, I still felt we'd get all three points, but unfortunately the problem in recent times of not creating chances came back to bite us. On this occasion, we created a massive number of chances but just couldn't put the ball in the back of the net.

All three games do show us that we're moving in the right direction and when that win is finally secured, I do feel that we're going to really kick on and become a force that can be talked about throughout the league.

We do need to start winning matches though and It's up to us to galvanise what we have in the squad and get them both confident and firing in the final third more frequently so we can put games to bed. Currently we are defending solidly and we transition well but need to be more clinical in front of goal.

There's been a few standout performers for me in the last few weeks. Gabe Cuthbert is a stand-out week in, week out and at 17 years old he's playing like a veteran of the game. The sky is the limit for the youngster. Carl Stewart is in fine form now and playing with such confidence and energy, he's a game changer and one player I will consistently push to start every game. Reece Price Placid has the ability to flip a game on its head and is also growing in confidence from playing regularly. They are the three standouts for me at the moment but that keeps changing and it can only be a positive that



we have players finding form, consistency and more importantly unity!

These two matches this week are key as it's now that the season really takes shape. Both games are against teams around us in the league but more importantly they're games at home. We want to and have to make our home ground more of a fortress. It's great that we're doing well away from home but if we combine that with wins at home the momentum will pick up and we will find ourselves moving up the league in a rapid fashion.

We were pleased to see Romario Jonas take part in his first training session and also a pre-match warm up on Saturday after a lengthy absence. it's a massive boost for the squad not only in terms of ability but what he brings to the squad on a personality level. He's a great character and can make a difference but we also have to be sensible. Two serious injuries to the same knee means we have to take precautions and we can't rush him. We will take it week by week, monitor him accordingly and take it from there.

MATCH ACTION DRAW SPECIALISTS WOODS DO IT AGAIN!

Northwood played out their fourth successive drawn game, all of them 1-1, equalling a record sequence from almost ten years ago, but are still in search of their first home league win after being pegged back by third-placed Ware.

After back-to-back draws away at Hitchin Town and MK Irish, hopes were high for further improvement for being back at the Skyline Roofing Stadium. There was an enforced change with the departure of leftback Mack Miskin who took up an offer following an approach to join Hayes & Yeading with Bryan Mankumbani taking over the role. Harry McKenna and Osa Otote both started for the first time for a few weeks while Jon-Jo Bates also came in as the midfield was reshuffled, OPR loanee Gabe Cuthbert made his home debut

Ware, who had seen a seven-match unbeaten run ended by Hitchin Town in midweek, were able to strengthen by welcoming Gucci Soulvaback to the club after a spell with Step 3 side Cheshunt while the experienced Jay Rolfe returned to the starting line-up after injury.

It was the Woods who made the better start to the firsthalf and after just six minutes, Dan Williams broke down the left to hit a fierce strike to the near post which Ware goalkeeper Ben Nightingale just managed to palm away. Four minutes later, Osa Otote managed to get a ball across the area from the right and Williams was onto it again but the angle was tight and he only found the side-netting.

12 MINUTES: 1-0 OSA OTOTE

Ware briefly went close when Finlay Titchmarsh's long-range strike hit the crossbar but the home side's pressure paid off on twelve minutes though when Otote found space to let fly with a low, right-footed shot that arrowed into the bottom corner, in off the post, giving Nightingale no chance.

Northwood were defending solidly and looking dangerous in attack with Ware restricted to one effort on goal though self-inflicted as Hafed Al-Droubi saved



from a Manny Folarin sliced clearance, pushing the ball onto the bar before it was headed clear.

The Woods then almost doubled their lead after twenty two minutes when awarded a free-kick centrally about twenty five yards out. McKenna was the new designated taker in Miskin's absence and his curling effort saw Nightingale dive to his right to just tip the ball onto the inside of the post. The ball spun back across the face of the goal and inches wide of the other post before going off for a corner.

Northwood continued to impress, Nightingale tipped away a dangerous inswinging corner from Carl Stewart and then Otote tried his luck from distance again but this time it was comfortably held by the 'keeper.

Ware's only real forage into the Woods danger-area was also from an inswinging corner with Al-Droubi pushing the ball away and when Reece Beckles-Richards seized on the loose ball, Mankumbani headed it clear.

It needed more of the same from Northwood as the second-half began and they again started positively with several forays down both flanks seeing crosses fired across by Ademide Baruwa, Bates and Williams but with no-one to provide the required touch.

56 MINUTES: 1-1 REECE BECKLES-RICHARDS

But, as the rain started to fall, Ware did manage to find a goal on fifty six minutes to get back in the game. The tricky Theo Ofori had been kept quiet by Mankumbani





but this time his shuffle saw the ball rebound fortunately into the path of Soulya who had made a good run into the box. His shot was well saved by Al-Droubi's legs but the ball bounced kindly to Beckles-Richards who stabbed it home from a few yards to take his tally to double-figures for the season.

The Woods continued to work hard in midfield with Omar Rowe outstanding and created opportunities with a Stewart corner being well cleared by a punch from Nightingale and after Freddie Ford had replaced the tiring Bates, Williams got on the end of a McKenna free-kick but steered his header wide of the post with the 'keeper beaten.

The final twenty minutes were filled with a series of substitutions which broke up play.

The Woods introduced firstly Reece Price-Placid for McKenna and then, when Williams was forced off with a worrying hamstring strain, Devonte Totesaut replaced him.

On eighty two minutes, one of the visitors substitutes, Johnny Allotey knocked in a dangerous cross which evaded everyone in the box and it was the Woods who finished the stronger again. Otote hit another shot from distance which was well wide and then, just before the end of normal time, Price-Placid cut in and hit a great shot that saw Nightingale dive to push the ball wide of the far post.

Stoppage-time stretched to six minutes and Ware were given an opportunity after Rowe was denied a free-kick when fouled in the centre immediately before the visitors were given one for a similar challenge wide on the right. Thankfully, the delivery was poor and both sides had to settle for just the one point.

SATURDAY 22ND SEPTEMBER 2012 FA CUP SECOND ROUND QUALIFYING

NORTHWOOD 1 AFC DUNSTABLE 1

A replay was needed to decide who progressed through to the FA Cup 3rd Qualifying Round after this heated and physical encounter finished 1-1 at a sunny Chestnut Avenue against the then Spartan South Midlands League high flyers AFC Dunstable.



The Woods were looking for an early goal to settle the nerves and they got exactly that. A short corner resulted in an exchange of passes between Walker and McCluskey and the midfielder showed decent composure tucking the ball away neatly from inside the penalty area – 1-0 to the home side after six minutes. VISITING THE SKYLINE STADIUM LONDON LIONS





In the summer of 1995, the players and officials of Maccabi Association London (MAL) decided that they had reached the limits of Sunday football and that a new challenge was required.

The Hertfordshire Senior County League was a popular choice, and the club made its debut in the 95/96 season under a new name of MALEX. Four years later the club had made many friends but had narrowly missed out on promotion from Division 1 in each season.

During the summer of 1999, the club revised its management structure, and decided to change its name to London Maccabi Lions, whilst retaining its all-Jewish status.

Under the management team of Bobby Fisher and Adam Solomons the 1st team lost only three league games that season as they won the Division 1 and reached the semifinals of the Aubrey Cup.

The club grew into one of the strongest teams in the Premier League but had to wait to land its first major honour in 2007 when Lions beat Metropolitan Police to lift the Herts Centenary Trophy.

This was supplemented by the Reserves who were also promoted as champions, in 2002, and made it to three Herts Reserve Cup finals, winning one in 09/10.

After a decade in the Herts Premier, in 2009/10 now under the stewardship of Tony Gold and Steve Grenfell, Lions won the Herts Senior County League for the first time in the club's history, winning promotion to the Spartan South Midlands League in the process.

The following season - the club's first in the South Midlands Division One - they added a second Herts Centenary Trophy beating Letchworth Garden City Eagles 3-2 in the final.







Lions were able to go one better in 2012/13, winning the South Midlands Division One title and promotion to the heights of the South Midlands Premier Division.

The club also made their debut in the FA Cup, winning 4-0 against Clapton. Now, just one league away from semi-professional football, it was a tall order for a team missing a number of players who had departed following promotion, and so 2013/14 saw Lions suffer their first ever relegation at the end of a difficult season.

Having steadied the ship, the club decided to return to the Herts Senior County League for 2015/16 in order to rebuild.

Seeking to promote a new generation under manager Andy Landesberg, there was immediate reward by winning the Anagram Records Trophy at the end of their first season, with most of the starting XI having come through the club's massive youth set up.

We then achieved an unprecedented treble in winning the league, Centenary Trophy and, for the first time, the Aubrey Cup.

The club was welcomed back to Spartan South Midlands League where we have won further honours in the shape of the Division One Cup (2018), Herts Centenary Trophy (2019) and Spring Cup (2021) while threatening to get promotion to the Premier Division before Covid struck.

The club was re-assigned to the Combined Counties League Division One in the summer of 2021 and we are again targeting promotion to the next step, as well as representing the community with pride.

The club was promoted to step 5 in 2021/2022 season and then last season, on a sun-drenched May Bank Holiday Monday at Rowley Lane, London Lions made history in front of a passionate home crowd, overcoming Wormley Rovers on penalties in a tense and thrilling Spartan South Midlands Premier Division play-off final to secure a first-ever promotion to Step 4 of the FA pyramid.

AFC DUNSTABLE





AFC Dunstable started life as Old Dunstablians Football Club in 1981, the name originating from an organisation formed in 1888 for old boys from Dunstable Grammar School. The most famous member of the club is Hollywood actor Gary Cooper, who attended the school in the early 1900's.

When the Grammar School closed and Manshead School opened they took over the mantle, but the old boys club was in decline. In 1981 the head teacher was asked if he could re-launch the name, hence the football club was born.

The club started in the Dunstable Alliance Football League for a couple of seasons then moved onto the Luton District and South Bedfordshire League in 1983. Still playing at Manshead School with the 1st team and reserves, success was limited with the 1st team runners up twice in Division One and runners up in the William Pease Cup. While in the Luton League though the 1st team did land the Bedfordshire

Junior Cup in 1989/90 season.

With the club using Dunstable Town Cricket Club as their social base, the cricket club was looking to move to a larger site in Totternhoe and when the new club was opened in 1994, a football pitch was accommodated, so the football club moved there too.

An improvement in facilities gave the club a chance to apply to join the South Midlands League in 1995. Accepted into Division One the club struggled, as they flirted with being relegated straight back to the Luton League in the first 2 seasons. Going through new managers every season, they finally started to gain some consolidation and in season. 2001/02 the team finished 4th in the league and won the Division One Cup. The following season they just missed out of the title, which was now named Division Two. They finally clinched the title the next season and were runners up in the Division Two Cup. Ground Grading issues were starting to stop the team progressing as two ground sharing

agreements were turned down by the league.

This was now the start of a trophy laden period, as the Division Two title was secured and back-to-back Bedfordshire Senior Trophy's plus the Division Two Cup was won again.

In 2003/04 the club decided to launch its youth policy. The club then made the decision to change its name to AFC Dunstable so not to get confused with the local rugby club.

The club kept the name The OD's, as their nickname. The youth setup was awarded the Charter Standard in 2005/06. The next big step was to become a Development Club and a great deal of work saw the club achieve this in 2007. Next up was a goal to become a FA Charter Standard Community Club and 2008 saw the club achieve this. In that time the club has been awarded the Development Club Of The Year in 2009.

The Bedfordshire Football



Association approached the club to become partners in the new Creasev Park Community Football Centre in 2008 and this gave them the chance to move the 1st team to Creasey Park and apply for promotion to Division One for the start of the 2009/10 season, which was accepted. The team finished a very creditable 5th in its first season at the higher level. History was made in the 2010/11 season, as the team was accepted to participate in the FA Vase. A fine run through to the Second Round Proper was achieved as well as finishing runners up in the league so gaining promotion to the Premier Division also winning the SSMFL Division One Cup.

Now with the team in the SSMFL Premier Division and entered in the FA Cup for the 2011/12 season, they finished third in the league. In the 2012/13 season the team consolidated in the Premier Division and finished a respectable eighth. Their run in the FA Cup saw them get through 3 rounds eventually going out to Northwood after a replay.

The team were being managed by the most successful pair in the club's history; Alex Butler and Dermot Butler, but they decided to step down after nine years at the helm halfway through 2013/14 season. This left the team in disarray, which saw many stalwarts of the team leave.

The club decided to appoint Steve Heath as manager and the club went on a rebuilding exercise. 2014/15 saw the team secure third place in the SSMFL Premier Division. They also equalled their best run in the FA Vase getting to the Third Round.

2015/16 was a stellar season. Before clinching the SSMFL Premier Division title, they progressed through two rounds of the FA Cup before going out to Ryman Premier leaders Leiston in the 1st Qualifying Round. The FA Vase was a great ride as the team made it to the Fourth Round proper. Unfortunately, they drew phoenix club Salisbury who had competed in the Conference Premier only two seasons previous.

The 2016/17 season saw them compete in the Southern League Central Division. They spent nearly all season in the play-off places but just missed out. The team did however

win the Bedfordshire Senior Cup.

After only their 2nd season at step 4, 2017/18 saw them top the table at the start of the season. They occupied a play-off place all season, which in the end saw them finish 5th.

2018/19 season was probably the most challenging as they stuttered at the start of the season. At Christmas they were flirting with relegation but turned the corner and went on a decent run that saw them looking at an outside chance of a play-off spot, but they fell away and finished 10th.

Following the disrupted 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons the 2021/22 season proved to be another record-breaking one for the OD's. Progressing the furthest they ever had in the FA Cup; AFC were knocked-out at home by step 3 Peterborough Sports in the Third Qualifying Round. The cup run was accompanied by an excellent performance in the league. Finishing third in the table, the OD's hosted Ware FC in the play-off semi-final but lost on penalties after the match had finished goalless.

The 2022/23 season proved to be the end of an era on and off the pitch. The team started well and were in and around the play-off spots until Christmas. The team found form hard to come by after that and finished 13th.

Chairman Simon Bullard announced in February 2023 that he was to step down from his role and Steve Heath announced weeks later that he was to leave at the end of the season. New custodians for the club were chosen in the shape of Varsity Nine, a sports management company

that specialises in delivering services for high performing players and student athletes. New managers were announced, with Joe Oxley and James Townsend taking on the men's first team lead at the end of the season

Last season 2024-2025 saw the club revert back to being committee run with Varsity Nine stepping aside. James Townsend (JT) was appointed First team manager with Joe Oxley moving over to be Director of Football. A momentous evening at Kenilworth Road in April saw the club win the Beds F.A. Senior Cup for only the second time with a 3-2 victory over Barton Rovers.

The Woods made it five league games unbeaten away from home but once again had to settle for a point apiece from this first-ever fixture against the Spartan South Midlands League Champions Milton Keynes Irish.

Following on from Saturday's hard-fought draw at play-off hopefuls Hitchin Town, the Woods made two changes to the starting line-up with Omar Rowe replacing the injured Reece Price-Placid, while Dan Williams returned, swapped with Rahzir Smith-Jones who was on the bench.

The home side came into the game having won two games in succession having scored nine goals, including a brilliant 5-2 success at Hadley so were full of confidence from the start of this contest.

27 MINUTES: 1-0 NASON SPENCE

It was a pretty even start to the game with both sides competitive in the midfield area and working hard but neither managed to penetrate in the final third with both defences looking on top until the Irish took the lead after twenty seven minutes. Freddie Ford conceded a free-kick for a rash challenge on Terry Shrieves, centrally just outside the box. Two players stood ready to have a go from the free-kick but it was skipper Mason Spence who took charge and deftly lifted the ball over the wall and inside the right-hand post.

Milton Keynes could have been two goals to the good just six minutes later and Spence was heavily involved again as he moved forward via three attempted forward passes, the latter of which was returned by Clinton Zawe onto his head but Woods goalkeeper Hafed Al-Droubi produced a great reflex save, pushing the ball over.

In a half of very few attacking moves, It took until the forty second minute for the Woods to finally create a chance themselves as Carl Stewart threaded a great ball through the Irish defence to put Williams in with a chance and though the Woods striker reached it first with his favoured left-foot, his powerful shot lacked accuracy and flew over the target.

The home side still threatened occasionally with Shrieves latching onto a loose ball from a tackle but firing an effort over the bar before the Woods rang the changes with Osa Otote replacing Totesaut and then Smith-Jones coming on for Ford.

Milton Kevnes almost doubled their advantage though on seventy minutes as their own two substitutes combined with Kyle Boyce knocking in an excellent cross to the far post with Harry Coleman stretching to connect but the ball hit the outside of the post.

It was after seventy nine minutes that the Woods managed to get back on level terms as Ademide Baruwa battled well down the left to get a cross in from the left and Williams met it with a first-time strike that flew past goalkeeper Tom Ladyman at his near-post.

Al-Droubi had to save a header high above his head a few minutes later but the closing stages brought very little excitement for the spectators and the game tailed off, despite five minutes of added time, without either side looking likely to find a winner.

Southall won 4-3 on penalties

The Woods suffered defeat on penalties to Isthmian League side Southall on Tuesday night under the lights at the Skyline Roofing Stadium after the two sides played out a goalless draw in the ninety minutes.

Both sides made several changes to their starting line-ups from their weekend games. The Woods were missing cup-tied Gabe Cuthbert and the injured Dan Williams, while Southall gave starting debuts to Aldershot Town goalkeeper Alex Walder and Vladyslav Karuchuk.

There was certainly a slow start to the game with neither side threatening much in the final third in the opening twenty minutes.

An early cross from Reece Price-Placid had the goalkeeper worried but it flew over the bar while Osa Otote twice picked up a ball from Freddie Ford just inside the box but couldn't get a shot off on either occasion.

On twenty one minutes, the Woods were awarded a free-kick about twenty five yards out centrally and Harry McKenna managed to get his shot on target but it was at Walder who held on comfortably. Otherwise, both defences were well on top.

On the half-hour, Price-Placid was played in down the right but his early shot flew across goal and well wide of the target while Southall were similarly wasteful with any chances they created as the half progressed. Hafed Al-Droubi hadn't really been threatened, though Makael Scott did manage to get a shot in from the left on thirty nine minutes but it was too weak to trouble the Woods 'keeper.

Half-time was approaching when Omar Rowe surged forward from midfield, exchanging passes before firing a shot which was just wide and Otote also tried his luck from distance but it was no real surprise that the break arrived without a goal.

There was little change at the start of the second-half though and ten minutes in, the visitors rang the changes, bringing on four of their more experienced players in an effort to turn things their way.

Northwood responded with a couple of their own as Ademide Baruwa replaced Carl Stewart while Otote made way for Hicham Bouchareb.

After sixty five minutes, the 'All went close when onetime Woods midfielder James McCluskey let fly with an excellent strike from outside the area and Al-Droubi pulled off a great save to deny him and a minute later they probably should have scored when substitute Daniel Roberts volleyed wide from close-range. Henry Atkinson limped off soon after, replaced by Jon-Jo Bates with Baruwa dropping to right-back as the Woods tried to get their shape back.

Al-Droubi had to be alert to tip a looping header from another substitute Brendan Matthew over the bar when Roberts got in a good chip across from the right and another of the visitor's newcomers, Bright Siaw caused a few issues with some tricky runs too.

The Woods final move was to bring on Under-18's forward Rowan Daly for a first-team debut on seventy nine minutes, replacing the ineffective Devonte Totesaut and he almost made an instant impact when getting in an angled shot from the right which flashed across the face of goal and wide of the far post, though a square ball to the onrushing Bouchareb would have been the better option.

Bates got in the final effort on goal just before the final whistle but his low shot lacked the power to beat Walder who saved easily.

So, it went to penalties with the Woods first to go and it was Al-Droubi who stepped up to fire in the opening spot-kick, Roberts levelled for Southall and then Price-Placid and Mitch Gough both netted to make it 2-2.

Walder then made a name for himself by flying to his right and saving really well from Bates before Al-Droubi kept out Matthew's effort in similar fashion.

The all-important kick came next as McKenna saw his strike again saved by the Southall debutant; it proved decisive. McCluskey scored to keep the pressure on and although Bouchareb tucked his kick away, it meant that Ryan Hope could win the game with his penalty and he coolly sent Al-Droubi the wrong way.

Southall move into the semi-finals of a competition they last won in 1955 and last reached the final back in 1986 so have a great opportunity to create some new history.
